IMPROVEMENT IN FIGURED DAMASK HAIR-SEATING.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 2,262, dated September 18, 1841.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SAMUEL Ross, of the city of Camden, in the county of Gloucester and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and Improved Mode of Manufacturing Figured Damask Hair-Seating; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description.

The nature of my invention consists in the introduction of an extra warp of silk, linen, cotton, or woolen, in addition to the one in general use in the manufacture of figured damask hair-seating.

I claim the invention of producing a satin or twilled groundwork, and at the same time I produce a full satin or twilled figure of any

color by the extra warp, which, when combined, produces a full satin or twilled face on the goods.

The old mode of manufacturing figured damask hair-seating is to make a satin or twill on one part of the goods only, where my improvement produces a full satin on the whole face of the fabric, both figure and ground. Therefore my claim is for the making of a satin or twilled groundwork, at the same time making a satin or twilled figure.
