


COFFIN.

Specification of Letters Patent No. 12,605, dated March 27, 1855.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, David Sholl, of Cincinnati, in the county of Hamilton and State of Ohio, have invented new and use-5 ful Improvements in Coffins; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the annexed drawings, making part of this specification, in which a coffin 10 of my proposed improved construction is represented in perspective, the lid a being represented as lifted a little above the case b so as to exhibit the devices for attachment and luting, the former consisting of lugs c, 15 which serve the twofold purpose of bearings for the bolts d and nuts e and also of handles.

The luting is accomplished by filling the groove f with cement immediately previous 20 to closing down the lid, which may be pro-

vided with a tongue to occupy the groove B.

The material of which I propose to make these coffins is terra cotta, I meaning by this term potter's clay or earth, molded to the desired shapes, and then hardened by bak- 25 ing or burning.

Several advantages may be claimed for a coffin thus made—great durability and susceptibility of being much ornamented or made to resemble marble are among these 30 advantages.

I claim as new and of my own invention— The production of a coffin composed of terra cotta or pottery ware.
