

## UNITED STATES PATENT OFFICE.

COAL OR ASH SIFTER.

Specification of Letters Patent No. 21,405, dated September 7, 1858.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, L. D. Bartlett, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented new and 5 useful Improvements in Sifters for Sifting Coal-Cinders and other Similar Substances; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description of the construction and operation of the same, refer-10 ence being had to the accompanying drawings, making part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 represents in elevation, the parts as used in connection with each other in sift-15 ing. Fig. 2, represents the parts without the sieve, half in section. Fig. 3, a plan of the same.

The object of my invention, is to construct the covers of vessels used as recepta-20 cles for ashes, so that, when sifting cinders in a common circular coal sieve, of the kind and size usually sold, it can be used in such a manner, as will prevent the escape of dust, and allow the ashes to pass at once into the <sup>25</sup> vessel without further handling.

As barrels are extensively used to deposit

ashes in, I will describe my invention as applicable to that vessel, and constructed of wood, though without limiting myself in

those particulars.

An annular ring A, formed with a rabbet around its inner circumference, with a cover B, fitting to it, together, complete a cover to the barrel; the sieve is used by removing the cover from the ring, and inserting the sieve 35 in its place; the cover then being used as a cover to the sieve. By rotating the sieve back and forth, the cinders are agitated, until the ashes are separated from the coal.

I do not claim using a circular sieve on 40 top, and fitting into the vessel, to be rotated back and forth, for that is old, and well known; but

I claim—

Using the annular ring, and the cover, in 45 combination with the sieve, substantially as described.
