BARZILLA HARRINGTON AND NELSON RUSSELL, OF CHINA, MAINE.

IMPROVEMENT IN TANNING.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 21,755, dated October 12, 1858.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, BARZILLA HARRING-TON and NELSON RUSSELL, both of the town of China, county of Kennebec, and State of Maine, have discovered a new Material for Converting Raw Rides into Leather; and we do declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof.

We use for the above purpose Comptonia asplenifolia or sweet fern, in lieu of bark or other tanning material. The fern is leached in the same way as bark in the usual mode of tanning, the use of a bark-mill being unnecessary.

The preparation of the hides is the same as in the usual process of tanning.

What we claim as our discovery is— The use of *Comptonia asplenifolia* or sweet fern, in room of bark or any other tanning material now in use.
