PEN-HANDLE.

Specification of Letters Patent No. 27,063, dated February 7, 1860.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Wm. A. Morse, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk, in the State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Penstocks; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the construction and operation of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawing, making a part of this specification, in which the figure is a prospective view.

I make a penstock of two pieces A, and D.
The part D, I provide with a knife H. I
connect these parts by means of a cylinder F
which serves as a sheath for the knife H.

The part D, and knife H, when drawn from out the cylinder F, may be used as a pen eraser, paper cutter, or pencil sharpener.

What I claim as my invention and desire 20 coors by Letters Patent is—

to secure by Letters Patent is— The cylinder F in combination with the parts A, and D, and knife H when the whole is constructed and connected substantially as described.
