

IMPROVEMENT IN TOBACCO-HOLDERS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 34,308, dated February 4, 1862.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, James Y. Leslie, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a Smoker's Companion, the construction and operation of which I have described in the following specification and illustrated in its accompanying drawings with sufficient clearness to enable competent and skillful workmen in the arts to which it pertains or is most nearly allied to make and use my invention.

The nature of my invention consists in furnishing the smoker with his tobacco, pipe, matches, and pipe-cleaner in a compact case.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure I is a plan section. Fig. II is a cross-section.

The main case 8 is made of tin or any other suitable material, and contains the tobacco, and to the top of which is the charger 2, and which is closed at the top with the stopper 1, and at the bottom by the hinged gate 3, which is kept closed by means of the spring 4, secured to the upper part of the case 8.

6 is the pipe-cleaner, placed in the receptacle 7. 5 is the pipe, placed in the receptacle 9; 10, the match-box, closed by means of the

When it is desired to charge the pipe with tobacco, the stopper 1 is taken out, the thumb pressing on the outer end of the charger 2, and the finger pressing on the upper and outer end, 12, of the gate 3, and upon the whole case being inverted the tobacco fills the charger 2, when the pressure upon 12 is released and the case again placed upright and the thumb removed from the end of the charger. A supply will be found of tobacco in the charger, which can be readily poured in the pipe without waste.

What I claim, and desire to be secured to

me by Letters Patent, is—

The combination and arrangement of the stopple 1, charger 2, gate 3, spring 4, matchbox 10, cover 11, pipe-cleaner 6, the receptacles 7 and 9, with the case 8, or their equivalents, for the purposes hereinbefore set forth and described.
