

IMPROVEMENT IN CARRIAGE-JACKS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 37,902, dated March 17, 1863.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, George L. Cummings, of the city and county of New York, and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Carriage-Jacks; and I do hereby declare that the same is fully described and represented in the following specifications and the accompanying letters, figures, and references thereof.

Of the said drawings, Figure 1 denotes an end view. Fig. 2 denotes a side view. Fig. 3 represents a vertical and central section of my improved jack.

In the drawings above referred to, letter A represents the base or feet, and letter B the upright side piece, all of which is made of hard wood or other material.

Letter C, Fig. 3, represents an eccentric lever, with its fulcrum at letter a, which lever, by bringing down, raises the slide-rest, (letter D,) lifting the carriage-axle, and at the same time locking the lever by its center resting on the fulcrum. The slide-rest (letter D) is guided up perpendicularly by two slots (letter E) in which a bolt and square collar or guide (let-

ter b) passes through, and the bolt fastened by a nut on the outside of the upright side (letter B.)

On the top of the slide rest (letter D) notches, (letter F,) are made upon an angle, so as to ad-

just itself to the axle.

In Fig. 3 the dotted lines represent the position of the lever (letter C) and rest (letter D) while ready for use.

I do not claim the locking of the lever, as described, neither do I claim the slot as a part of my invention; but

What I do claim is—

The combination of the eccentric lever C with the upright slide-rest D, by which the power to raise the axle is obtained, substantially as described and set forth as above.
