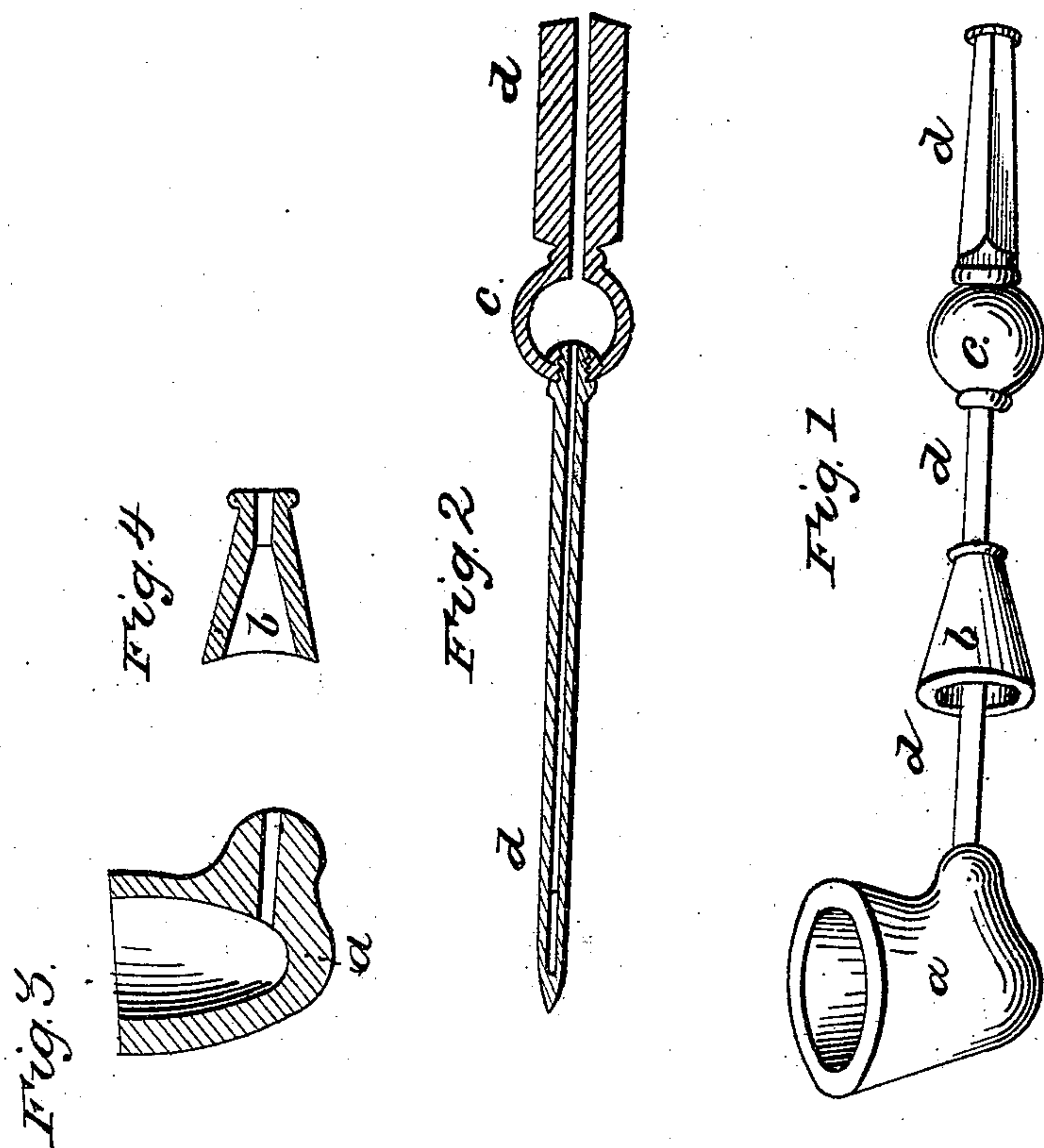

## IMPROVEMENT IN TOBACCO-PIPES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 38,883, dated June 16, 1863.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, CHARLES CHINNOCK, of the city of Brooklyn, Kings county, and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Device for a Cigar-Holder and Pipe; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

Figure 1 shows the device complete. *a* is the pipe, to be taken off when the other parts are used for a cigar-holder. *b* is the movable cigar-socket, sliding on the stem *d*. *c* is the chamber for collecting the oil and moisture. *d d d* are the tube or piercer for cigars and the mouth piece, connected by the oil-chamber *c*.

Fig. 2 shows the cigar-piercer in section and the screw connecting it with the globe and mouth-piece.

Fig. 3 shows section of the pipe and place for the insertion of the pierced end of *d*, Fig. 2.

Fig. 4 shows a section of the slide or holder for the point of the cigar and socket of the pipe.

The object of this invention is to make a small portable pocket-piece that can be used either for a pipe or for cigars. When used for a pipe, the pierced end *d*, Fig. 2, passes into the pipe, and the cigar-holder *b*, Figs. 1 and 4, slides up tight on the socket of the pipe. When used as a cigar-holder, the pointed end *d*, Fig. 2, is punched into the cigar, which is held at the point by the slide *b*. As the cigar is smoked, the slide *b* may be drawn out, so that a fresh inch or half-inch of the cigar may be smoked without destroying the fresh flavor of the tobacco by drawing the smoke through all the cigar.

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The pointed and punctured tube *d*, the movable cap, and cigar and pipe holder *b*, for the purposes set forth.
