IMPROVEMENT IN HAIR-RESTORATIVES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 39,304, dated July 21, 1863; antedated November 1, 1862.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John Moye, of Medina, in the county of Orleans and State of New York, have invented a new and useful Compound or Hair-Restorative; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the ingredients and manner of compounding the same, which is in the following proportions, to wit:

One pint of castor-oil, five pints of alcohol, one pint of tincture of lobelia, one pint of tincture of blood-root, two ounces of laudanum, one-half ounce of citronella, one-fourth ounce of bergamot, fifteen drops of oil of cloves, fifteen drops of cinnamon.

A compound made of the above ingredients in the proportions stated is found to be an excellent wash for the hair, as it removes all dandruff from the cuticle and gives the hair

a soft and silky appearance. Besides, also, being a preservative of the hair, it stimulates a healthy action, promotes its growth, and prevents its falling out.

The above compound also possesses medicinal qualities which render it equally valuable in allaying inflammation of burns and scalds, &c., and for the reduction of fevers.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The within-described compound or composition, made of castor-oil, alcohol, tincture of lobelia, tincture of blood-root, laudanum, citronella, bergamot, oil of cloves, and cinnamon, in the proportions herein set forth.
