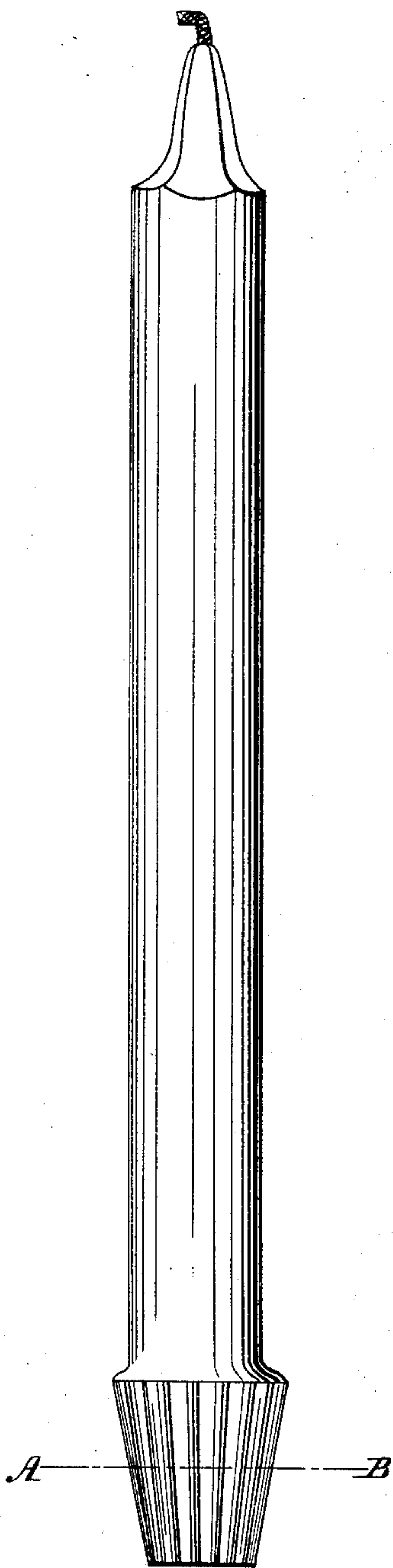

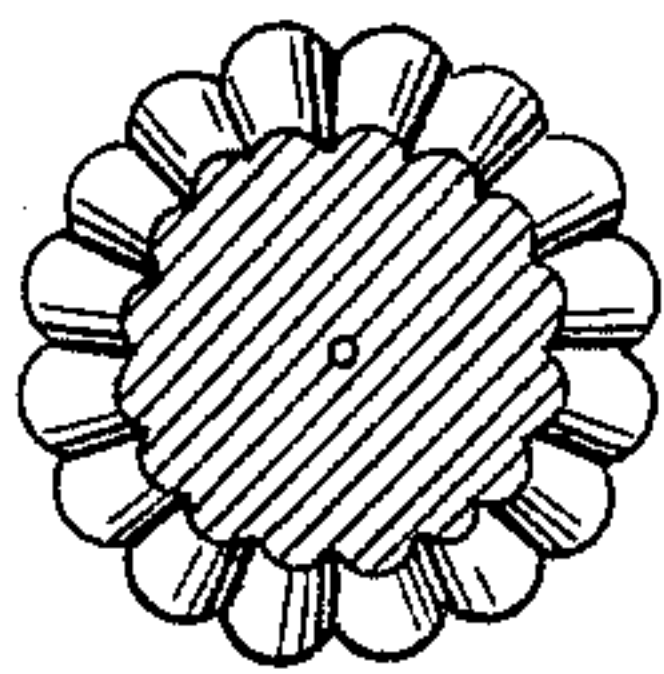

## IMPROVEMENT IN THE MANUFACTURE OF MOLDED CANDLES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 46,197, dated January 31, 1865.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JOHN LYON FIELD, of Upper Marsh, Lambeth, in the county of Surrey, Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in the Manufacture of Mold-Candles; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings.

My invention consists of a mold-candle, the lower end of which is made of a tapering form, so that it may fit various sizes of sockets of candle-sticks without cutting the candle or wrapping the same.

In order to enable others to make my invention, I will now proceed to describe the manner of constructing the same.

The accompanying drawing represents my improved candle, the main body of which is of the usual cylindrical form. A portion of the lower end, however, is enlarged, and made of the tapering shape shown. This tapering end may be grooved or corrugated or plain, or may

have several sides. In either case, it can be readily adjusted into different-sized sockets without cutting the candle or wrapping it, as usual.

I claim as my invention and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

A molded candle, the lower end of which is made of a tapering form, substantially as represented and described, for the purpose set forth.
