IMPROVED MEDICAL COMPOUND.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 46,449, dated February 21, 1865; antedated February 16, 1865.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALFRED P. CORYELL, of Janesville, in the county of Rock and State of Wisconsin, have invented a new and Improved Medical Compound; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to fully understand and use the same.

The object of this invention is a compound which by practice has been found to be a sure remedy for smallpox, to be used by persons of both sexes, and by children as well as grown persons.

The compound is made of the following in-

gredients: nitric acid, two ounces; citric acid, one ounce; sweet spirits of niter, four ounces; spirits of turpentine, one ounce; bitartrate of potassium, two ounces, diluted with distilled water.

I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The use of a compound made of the ingredients above specified mixed together in about the proportion and substantially in the manner set forth.
