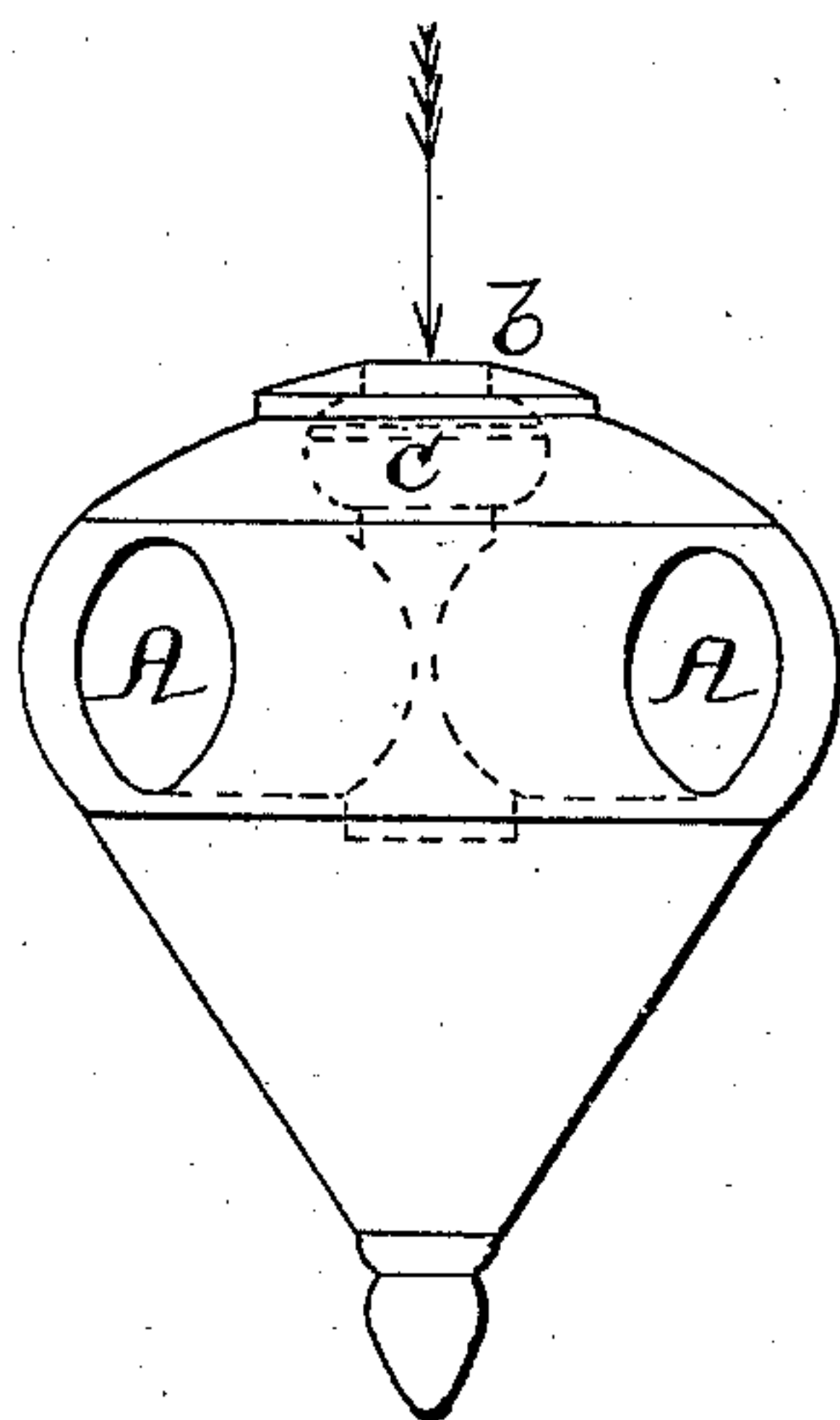
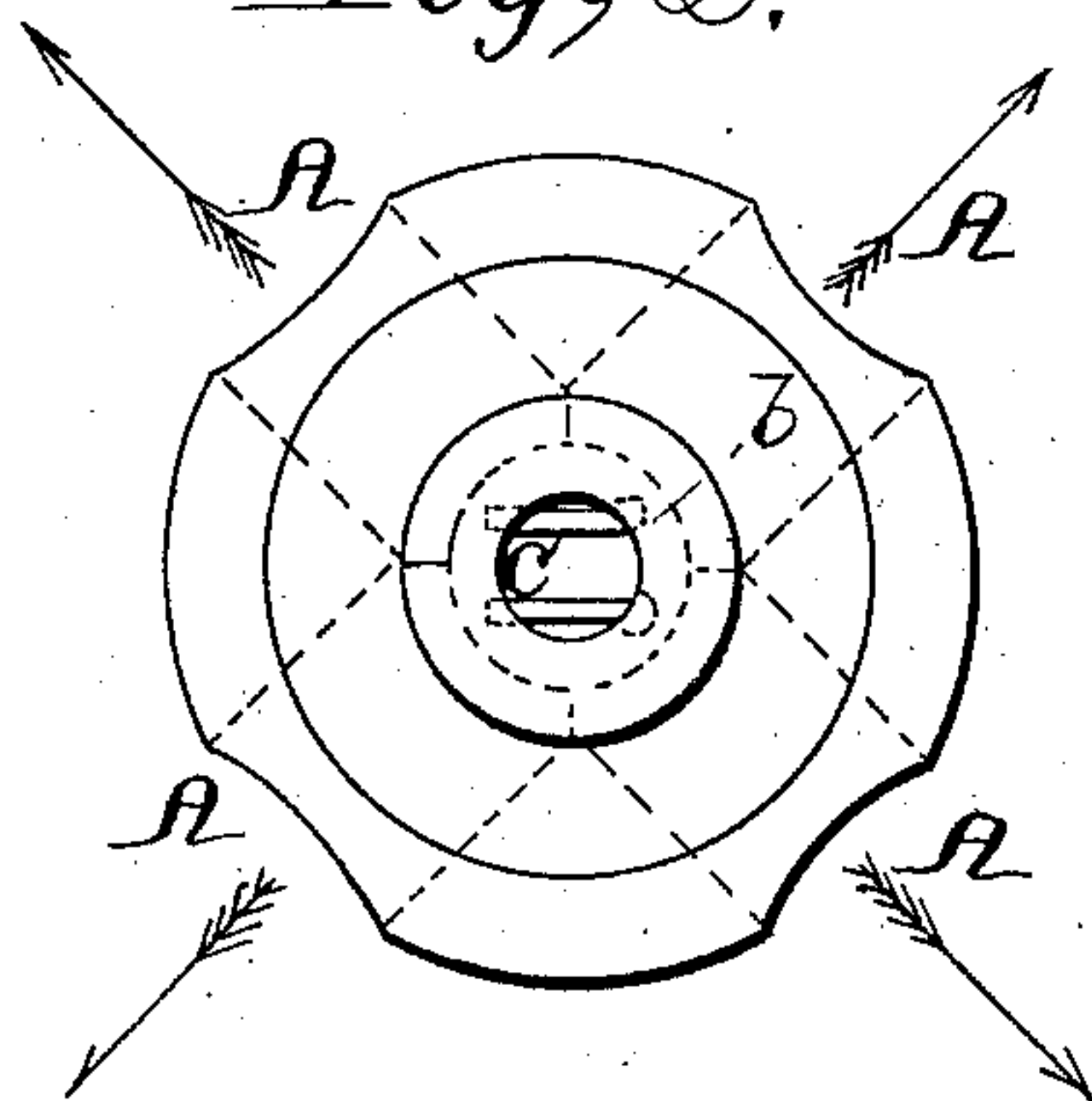

SPINNING-TOP.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **55,666**, dated June 19, 1866.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, EDWARD E. JONES and GEORGE L. KITSON, of the city of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented an amusing and Improved Spinning-Top, which we call an "Eolian or Musical Top," of which the following is a specification.

The shape is similar to an ordinary top, as seen by the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification.

A A represent holes made in the sides of the toy or top, connecting with the hole C. The object of the holes A A is to throw by centrifugal force the air from the top while spinning, the hole C in the center to supply the

space thus relieved with air. In the hole C is a musical attachment, which is made to vibrate by the air thus forced through the hole C by the rapid revolution of the top.

What we desire to secure by Letters Patent, and what we claim, is—

The holes A A, with the hole C in the center of the top, in combination with a musical attachment, for the purpose herein described—an Eolian or musical top.
