

## IMPROVED SPRING-BEDSTEAD.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 55,680, dated June 19, 1866.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Rufus Lapham, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and useful Device for Applying Springs to Bedsteads, Sofas, Lounges, &c.; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the construction and operation of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of bedstead; Fig. 2, a perspective view of the mode of fastening the center piece, a; Fig. 3, end view of

the springs.

I provide a center piece, a, of any desired dimension or material, constructing the same so as to leave the interstices b b b b in such manner that the springs c c c may incline upward at a given angle for the reception of the cross-piece or spring d d d. Said center piece a is fastened in any manner to the head and foot boards of the bedstead, sofa, or lounge, or keyed in the manner as shown in the drawings. The springs c c c are constructed in such manner as to fit the interstices b b b snugly, the upper ends being slotted so that the cross-

pieces or top springs, d d d, which have pins e e on their under ends, fit in said slots, as shown in Fig. 3. The ends of said springs d d d are provided with rounded ends or projections, so as to prevent the mattress or bedding from slipping. I also provide one more thin slat running parallel with the center piece, a, which serves in keeping the springs d d d in their place.

This spring recommends itself for its simplicity and applicability to other articles of household furniture. The application of the center piece adds more strength to the bed-stead.

What I claim as my invention, and desire

to secure by Letters Patent, is-

The center piece, a, or its equivalent, with the interstices b b, the springs c c c, with their slots, the cross-pieces or springs d d d, with their pins e e, fitting in the slots of c c c, in combination, operating substantially as described and for the purposes set forth.
