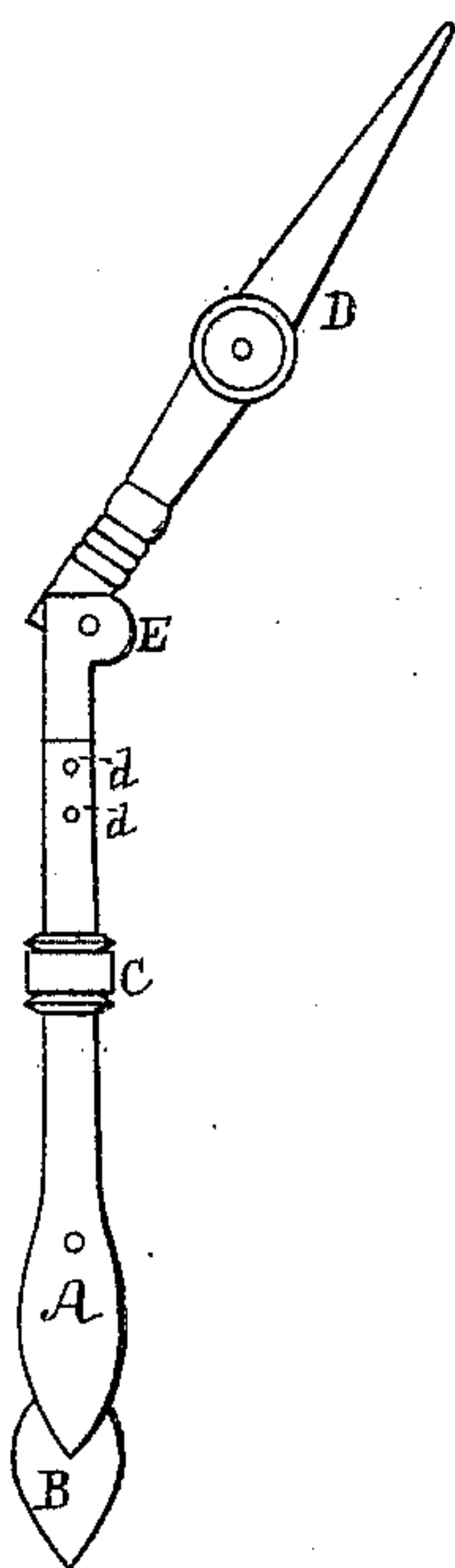
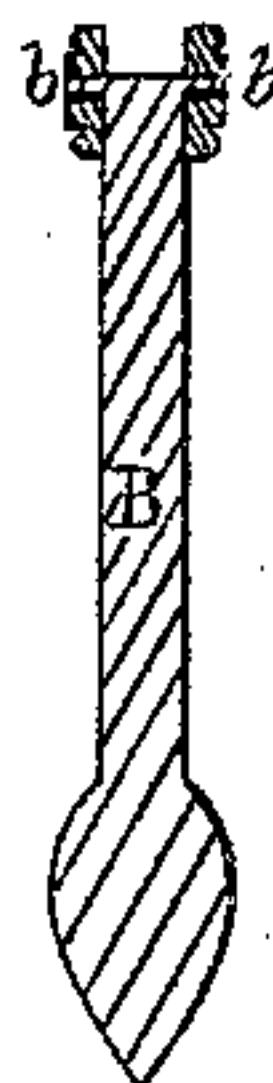

## PEN AND ERASER COMBINED.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **56,455**, dated July 17, 1866.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JOSEPH SCHOTT, of the city of Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a new and useful Combination of Drawing-Pen and Eraser; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, making part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 represents side view of the tool, and Fig. 2 represents the eraser.

The object of my invention, combined drawing-pen and eraser, is to produce a tool which would combine both drawing-pen and eraser, and so arranged that the last would not interfere in using the first; besides, to make the tool folding, so that it might be conveniently carried in a pocket.

To enable others to make and use my invention, I will describe its construction and operation.

I make the handle of my pen A of two pieces, which are flat and wider at the bottom, holding between them an eraser, B. The eraser has a flat handle, at the top of which there are two projections or pins, *b b*. Its flat part

is inserted between the two halves of the handle, and the pins are fitted into the holes of a metallic ring, C, sliding on the round part of the handle and riveted. By sliding forth or back the ring C the eraser comes out or enters into the handle. Instead of a ring, a slot in the handle and a spring with a pin attached to the flat part of eraser or some other arrangement may be used. The drawing-pen D is attached to the other end of the handle by rivets *d d*, and has a knee-joint, E, so that the pen when unfolded may be used conveniently in drawings, and when folded make the whole tool of twice smaller length, thus making it convenient to carry in a pocket.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The combination of the folding drawing-pen with sliding eraser, the whole arranged as above described, and for the purpose herein specified.
