

IMPROVEMENT IN TAGS.

CHARLES A. MOORE OF WEST BROOK, CONNECTICUT.

The Schedule reserred to in these Aetters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, Charles A. Moore, of West Brook, in the county of Middlesex, in the State of Connecticut, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Tags (or tickets) used on cloth and other articles of merchandise; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being also had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

The nature of my invention consists in attaching a metallic clasp or fastening at both ends of a single thread, tape, or string, one of which fastenings is attached to the card, (or ticket,) and the other to the cloth.

Figure 3 represents the clasp to which the card is attached, it being a thin piece of brass, or other suitable metal, having upright teeth at the sides, which are passed through the card and pressed down flat, thus fastening it to the string. The string may be clasped either beneath or on the face of the card.

Figure 2 represents the part (or clasp) which is attached to the cleth. It is so formed that by pinching up one end or side, the string is fastened to it. On the other side, or opposite edge or end, is a pointed upright tongue or pin, which is pushed through the cloth and bent down, thus clasping it.

Figure 1 represents the tag in use.

The object of my invention is, to render the tag more convenient and durable, and more neat in appearance than those in use. It being more readily and securely tucked between the folds of a roll of cloth, it is less liable to be mashed, or chaffed off in handling, or in transporting, and is more neat in appearance than the tag attached by wire solely.

What I claim, and desir; to secure by Letters Patent, as my invention, is—
The interposing, or placing between metallic fastenings, the thread, tape, or twine, substantially as specified, and for the purpose herein set forth.
