IMPROVED MEDICAL COMPOUND.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM B. FOSTER, of Ridgeville, in the county of Lorain, and State of Ohio, have invented a new and improved Medical Compound; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable those skilled in the art to make and use the same.

The present invention relates to a medical compound especially intended for the relief and cure of colic, cholera morbus, cholera, diarrhoea, heart disease, rheumatism, white swelling, head and tooth-ache, coughs and colds, etc. This compound is made of the following ingredients mixed together in about the proportions herein stated, viz: three quarts (3 qts.) alcohol, one ounce (1 oz.) sassafras, one ounce (1 oz.) hemlock, one ounce (1 oz.) oil cedar, one ounce (1 oz.) camphor gum, one ounce (1 oz.) laudanum, two ounces (2 oz.) cayenne.

The several ingredients above named having been mixed together, the whole mixture is to be well shaken, and being allowed to stand for two or more hours is ready for use. The compound may be used externally as well as internally, with great benefit and advantage.

I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The medical compound made of the several ingredients mixed together in or about the proportions, substantially as described.
