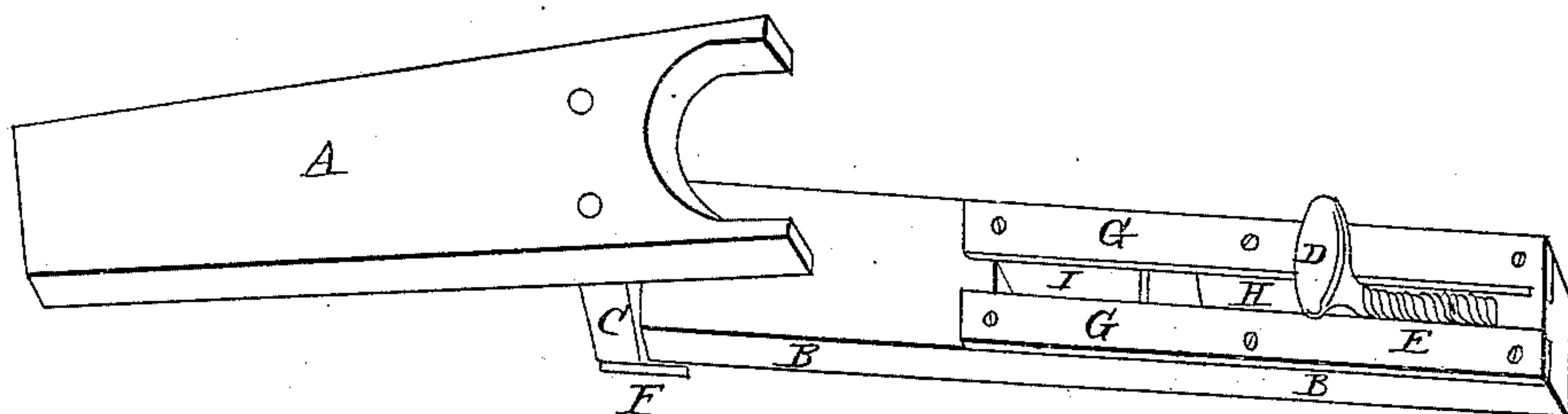
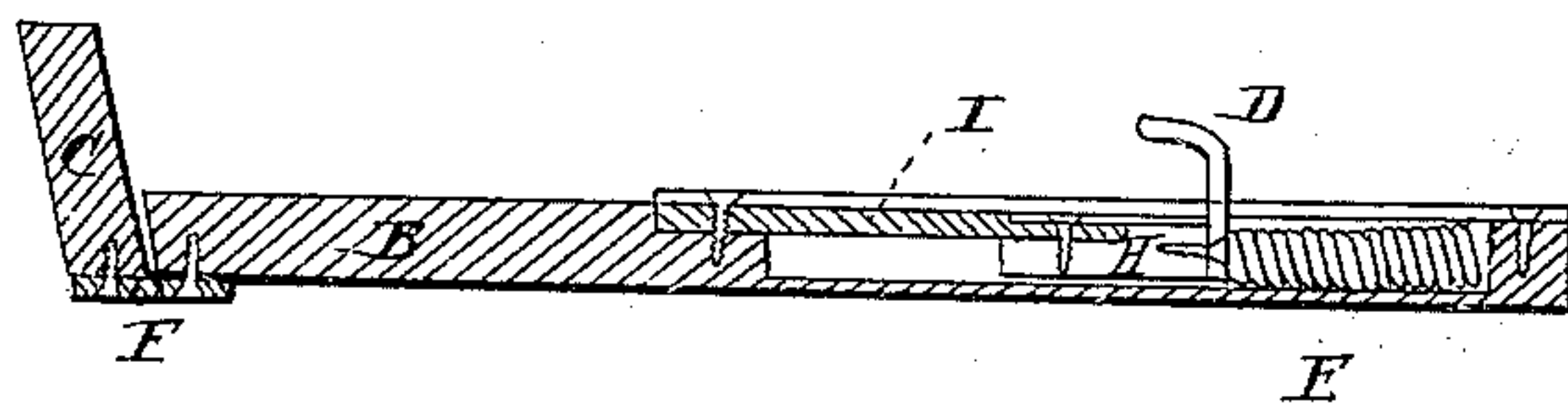

IMPROVED BOOT-JACK.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, WALTER S. PEFFER, of Carlisle, in the county of Cumberland, and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and improved Boot-Jack; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, making a part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view; and

Figure 2, a longitudinal section.

I construct my boot-jack out of any suitable material. The part A is made in the usual form, having a foot, C, to which is hinged the part B B; at F it is provided with a movable toe-piece, D, which is acted on either with a spiral, E, or gum-elastic spring, I. The toe-piece is secured to the movable block H, which is kept in place with two metal strips, G G. The object of the hinge F is to fold the two parts together in a compact form. The use of this instrument is apparent from above description and drawings.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A boot-jack with the two parts hinged together at F, and the part B B provided with a movable toe-piece, D, acted on by any suitable spring, substantially as specified within.
