

IMPROVEMENT IN SKATE-SHARPENERS.

The Schedule referred to in these Actters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, W. F. Hellen, of the city of Washington, and District of Columbia, have invented a new and useful Adjustable Skate-Sharpener; and I do hereby declare the following to be an exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, making a part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 represents a perspective view; and

Figure 2, a cross-section.

The nature of my invention consists in the construction of the slotted guides B, as adjusted by the screw E and the set-screws D, all in combination with the adjustable file A. A represents the flat file, that may be made of any size or shape, the file fitting into corresponding shaped slots C of square guides or metallic plates, B, the one side of file being held firmly in the slot and adjusted by set-screws D passing through the top edge of one of the plates B, the other guide-plate B moving back or forward on the file by means of the adjusting screw E, so as to open the space between the guide-plates B of sufficient width to operate the file on any sized skate, the bottom of the skate being sharpened by the file, and the guide-plates B moving on each side of the runner of the skate, the plate in red lines showing how it is adjusted and operated by the adjustable screw E.

I am aware of a file being riveted and permanently fixed between side-plates for sharpening a skate, but

these I do not claim; but what I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

The slotted guide-plate B, with the adjustable screws D and set-screw E, combined with an adjustable file of any required size or shape, when constructed, arranged, and operated as herein described and for the purposes set forth.
