IMPROVED SOAP FOR CLEANING AND POLISHING WOOD, METALS, AND OTHER MATERIALS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that we, J. T. GREENWOOD and JESSE WILSON, of the city of Beloit, county of Rock, and State of Wisconsin, have invented certain new and useful improvements in Soap for Cleaning Dirt or Grease from Paint or Varnish on Wood or Metal, and for cleaning and polishing metals, iron, tin, plated ware, silver, and gold, composed and compounded of the following articles or ingredients, to wit, of equal parts of Green Mountain quartz, hydraulic, Roman, and Rosendale cement, and common bar soap, made by boiling together, with the addition of one gallon of water to each one hundred pounds of ingredients, as above set forth, to be well stirred while boiling.

What we claim as our invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A new article of manufacture, an improved soap for cleaning painted work, and polishing metals, tin, gold, silver, and plated ware, composed of the ingredients herein stated, in about the proportions specified, for the purpose set forth.
