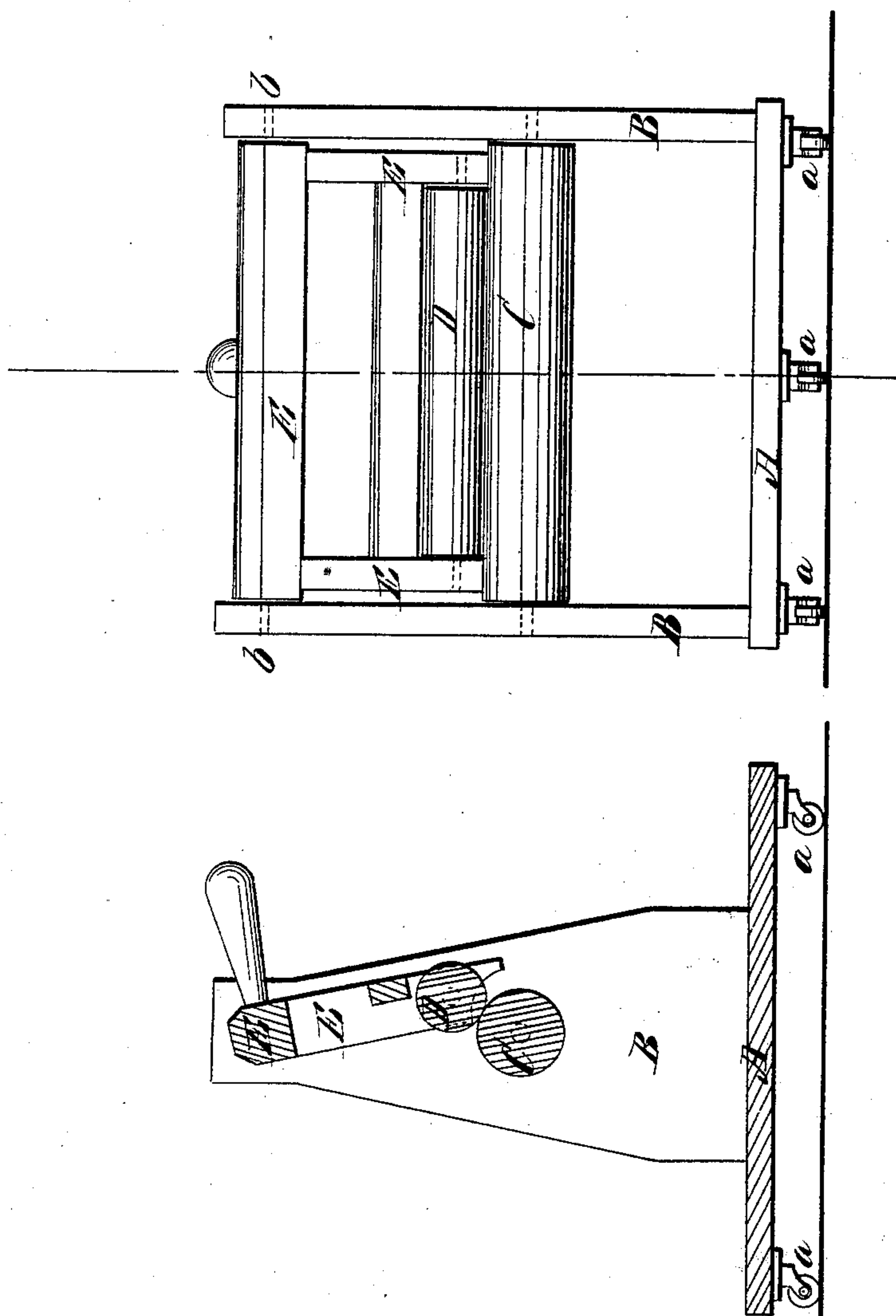

IMPROVED MOP-WRINGER.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, CHARLES E. WAREHAM, of Sedalia, in the county of Pettis, and State of Missouri, have invented a new and improved Mop-Wringer; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable those skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part of this specification.

This invention relates to an improved mop-wringer, and consists of two rollers, one of which is journaled in an upright, and the other in a frame journaled in the same upright, the whole set on a flooring running on casters. In the accompanying drawings—

Figure 1 is a back view of my improved mop-wringer, and

Figure 2 a section thereof at line *x x*.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

A is the floor set on the caster *a*. B B are two uprights, in which the roller C is journaled. D is another roller journaled in the frame E, which is journaled in the upright B at *b* vertically over the bearings of the roller C.

To wring the mop the roller D is held to roller C with one hand, while the other draws the mop between them.

I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

1. The roller D set in the swinging-frame E, which is journaled in B, all as set forth, in combination with the roller C, also journaled in B, in manner and for the purpose substantially as described.
2. The mop-wringer, composed of two rollers D and C. mounted in the uprights B B on floor A, and casters *a*, substantially as described.
