

IMPROVEMENT IN HEMMERS FOR SEWING MACHINES.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, JAMES R. HAGGERTY, of Hillsdale, Hillsdale county, Michigan, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Hemmers for Sewing Machines; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part of this specification.

This invention relates to an improved hemmer for sewing machines, and consists in a hemmer having hinged edge-turners. The accompanying drawing is a perspective view of my improved hemmer.

A is a plate, by which the hemmer is attached to the sewing machine. B is the hemmer-plate, the edge-turners C C' being hinged at *c* and *c'*. A spring, *d*, holds the edge-turners down upon the cloth or other material to be hemmed. By means of the hinges *c c'*, the hemmer can be adapted to every kind of cloth which can pass under the foot of the machine.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A hemmer, provided with hinged edge-turners, substantially as and for the purposes described.
