


IMPROVED BREAST-STRAP SLIDE.

The Schedule referred to in these Xetters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, ISAAC RORABACK, of South Bend, in the country of St. Joseph, and in the State of Indiana, have invented certain new and useful improvements in "Breast-Strap Slides;" and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

In the annexed drawings, making part of this specification, A represents the slide, which consists of a concavo-convex cast metallic plate. This plate has cast upon its concave side an arm, B, and two jaws c c, between which jaws is pivoted a tongue, d. A spring is placed under the pivoted end of tongue d, which throws it up against the arm B, the two serving to form a snap-joint. Upon the convex side of the slide is cast a broad groove, said groove being covered at its ends by a loop or keeper.

In using this slide the convex side is the under side. A strap is passed under the loops, and lies in the groove on the under side of the slide. Snap-hooks are secured to each end of the strap, and these hooks are caught in the rings on the hames. The neck-yoke ring at the end of the breast-chain is passed over the slide, and the tongue d being pressed down, said ring is caught and held on the concave side of the slide. The slide A shifts or slides upon the strap as the motion of the horse may require it. The strap which passes around the slide A is provided at its ends with metallic loops x, which are pivoted, and confine the snap-hooks to said straps.

Having thus fully described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is— The curved slide A, when provided with its arm B, jaws c c, and tongue d, with its spring, as and for the purposes specified.
