


### IMPROVEMENT IN PAPERING PINS.

The Schedule referred to in these Vetters Patent and making part of the same.

### TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, G. L. Turney, of London, England, have invented a new and improved Pin-Book; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part of this specification.

The present invention relates to a holder for pins, which is in the form of a book, the pins being inserted in the several leaves constituting the book, which leaves are bound together at one edge, and are provided with suitable shaped cover or lid pieces for enclosing or shutting up the whole series of leaves forming the book. In the accompanying plate of drawings my improved pin-book is illustrated—

Figure 1 being a view of one side of the book when closed or shut up, but with such side broken out at one end to show the interior arrangement of leaves to the book, and

Figure 2 an end view.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

A, in the drawings, represents the pin-book, which is formed of a series of paper leaves, B B, secured together at and along one edge, C, but at the other folded over, so as to be more perfectly adapted to receive the pins, which are secured thereto by inserting them in the paper leaves, in a manner similar to that employed for the ordinary papers for pins. D, outside pieces secured to leaves B of pin-book, which pieces are of suitable size and shape that when closed about the several leaves B they will enclose or encase the same.

I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent-

As a new article of manufacture, a pin-book, constructed as described, consisting of the separate leaves B secured together at one edge C, their outer edges bent over to receive the pins, all enclosed in the cover D, as herein set forth for the purpose specified.
