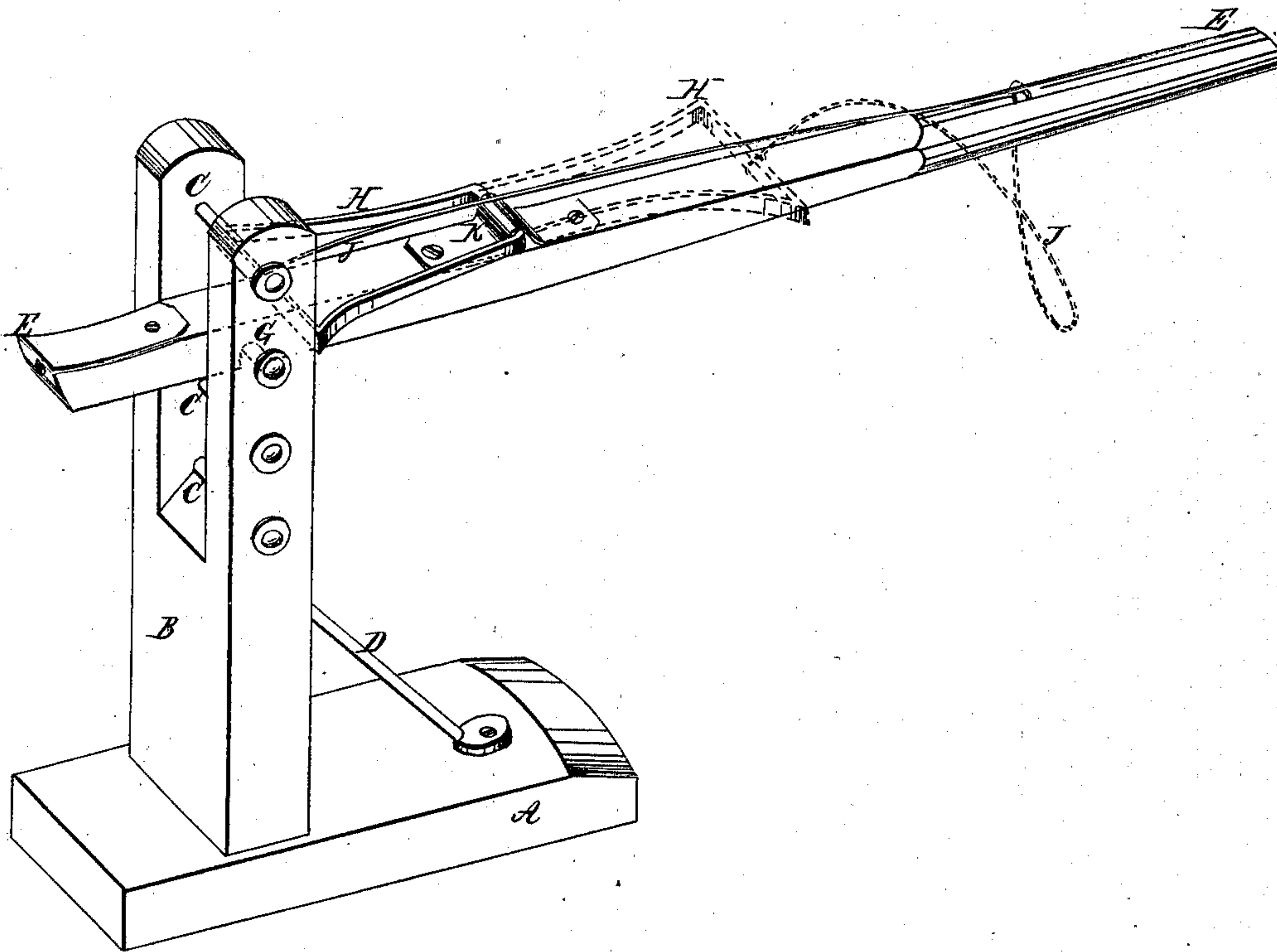

IMPROVEMENT IN LIFTING-JACK.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known, that I, ABRAHAM C. BRINSER, of Middletown, Dauphin county, and State of Pennsylvania, have invented an "Improved Lifting-Jack;" and I do hereby declare the following to be an exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my invention consists in the square reversible link and rope on top of the lever, in combination with the stationary bolts on the post.

A represents the platform or plank that supports the jack; B, the upright post. C are the bolts running through the post, that are made stationary and permanent by being bolted or riveted on each end. D is a stay, extending from the post to the plank A to support the post. E is the lever, with a notch, G, to rest upon any of the bolts or stationary pins C. On the top of the lever E is an adjustable and reversible square link, H, that is adjusted and set against the post B, to brace the lever and bear against the post, so as to support the axle of a wagon or any similar weight when raised, and hold it securely to its place, and when the axle is to be lowered, the link is reversed or drawn back by means of the rope J, that is connected to the link H and the lever E, as shown by the red lines, the link H operating on a hinge, K, on the top of the lever E.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The square reversible link H, with its rope J, when arranged and combined with the movable lever E and post B, with its stationary pins or riveted bolts C, as herein described and for the purposes set forth.
