

SCOOPS FOR SCALES.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, FREDERICK MEYER, of Newark, in the county of Essex, and State of New Jersey, have invented a new Improvement in Scoops for Scales; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

My invention consists in the construction of a scoop, A, of one piece of metal, pressed or otherwise formed into shape.

The advantages over the common scoop made with a seam in the middle crosswise are, first, lessening the expense of manufacture; second, greater strength; third, saving the dirt or other matter from collecting at the seam and thereby preventing the balancing of the scale; fourth, greater durability; fifth, improvement and elegance of appearance.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

As an article of manufacture, a scoop for scales made of one piece of metal, as and for the purpose specified.
