

IMPROVEMENT IN PLOUGH-WHEEL.

The Schedule reserred to in these Vetters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that we, J. B. Webster and Robert Baxter, of the city of Stockton, county of San Joaquin, and State of California, have invented a new and improved Plough-Wheel; and we do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

The nature of our invention consists in boxing up the sides a, Figure 1, of the common cast-iron plough-wheel, so as to present a smooth surface for the sides, and even with the edges of the wheel, thereby preventing the wheel from clogging up, on account of its filling with mud and weeds caught up by its edges, as is the case where the common skeleton wheel is used.

To enable others skilled in the art to construct and use our invention, we will proceed to describe its con-

struction and operation.

We construct the wheel, as usual, of cast iron, in any of the known forms, as b, fig. 1, and within the rim of the wheel, on each side thereof, facing with the edge of the rim, we insert a thin piece of board, nail plate, or east iron, of circular shape, prepared for the purpose, a, fig. 1, fitting closely within the rim, as in fig. 1. These boards or plates a, fig. 1, are secured in place by means of screws c, fig. 1, passing into them through the rim of the wheel.

What we claim as our invention, and desire Letters Patent for, is—
The board or plates a, fig. 1, in combination with the wheel, as and for the purpose hereinbefore described.
