IMPROVEMENT IN SWIFT.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL PERSONS TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

Be it known that I, EBEN M. COFFIN, of Woburn, in the county of Middlesex, and State of Massachusetts, have invented an Improved Swift for reeling a skein of thread or yarn; and do hereby declare the same to be fully described in the following specification, and represented in the accompanying drawings, of which—

Figure 1 is a side elevation,

Figure 2 a longitudinal section, and

Figure 3 a transverse section of it.

In the drawings, A A are two furcated arms arranged between the two jaws a b of a rotary clamp, B, and applied to one of such jaws, so as to be capable of being moved on centres c c extended therefrom, the same being so as to enable the two arms to be moved on the centres c c, either toward or away from one another. A screw, d, goes through the movable jaw b, and screws into the other jaw, which is erected on a base, d', to which the jaw b is hinged. A pivot or journal, c, projects down from the base of the clamp B, and turns in a bearing, f, made in another or screw-clamp C, which is formed and provided with a screw, g, in manner as represented in the figures.

By means of the clamp C the swift may be fixed to the edge of a table. The skein is to be placed within the forks of the two arms, and such arms are to be turned down until the skein may be stretched out with a sufficient tightness to keep it in the forks, while the arms and their clamp B may be put in revolution during the process of winding the skein.

I claim the improved swift as made of the two forked arms A A and the two clamps B C, arranged and combined substantially in manner as specified.
