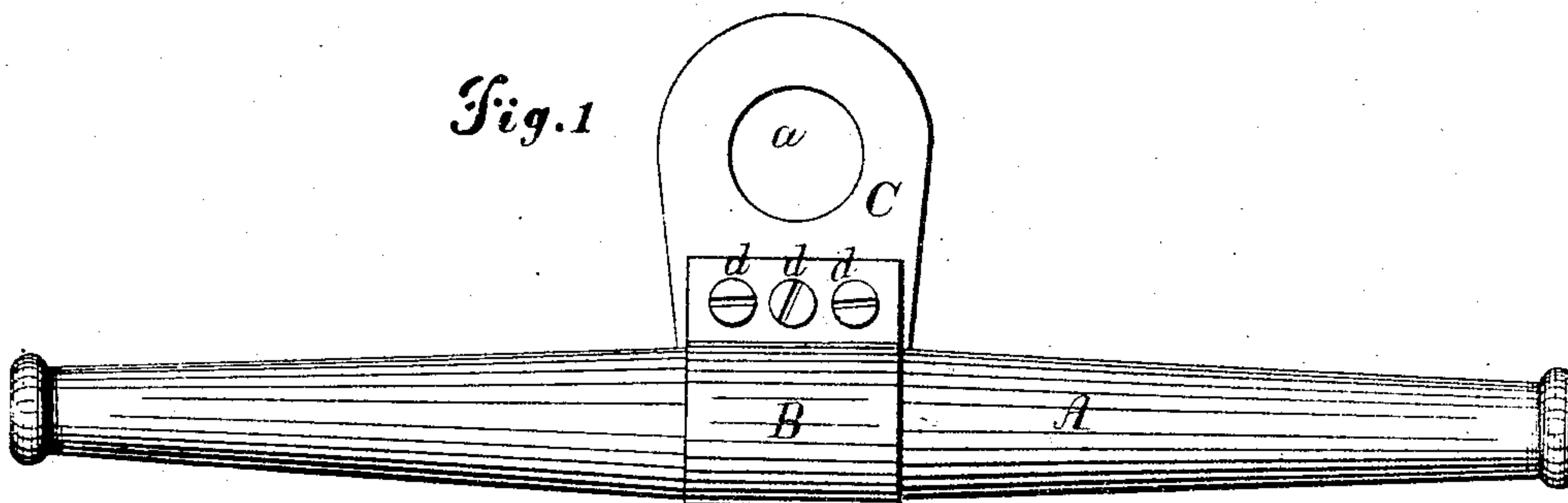
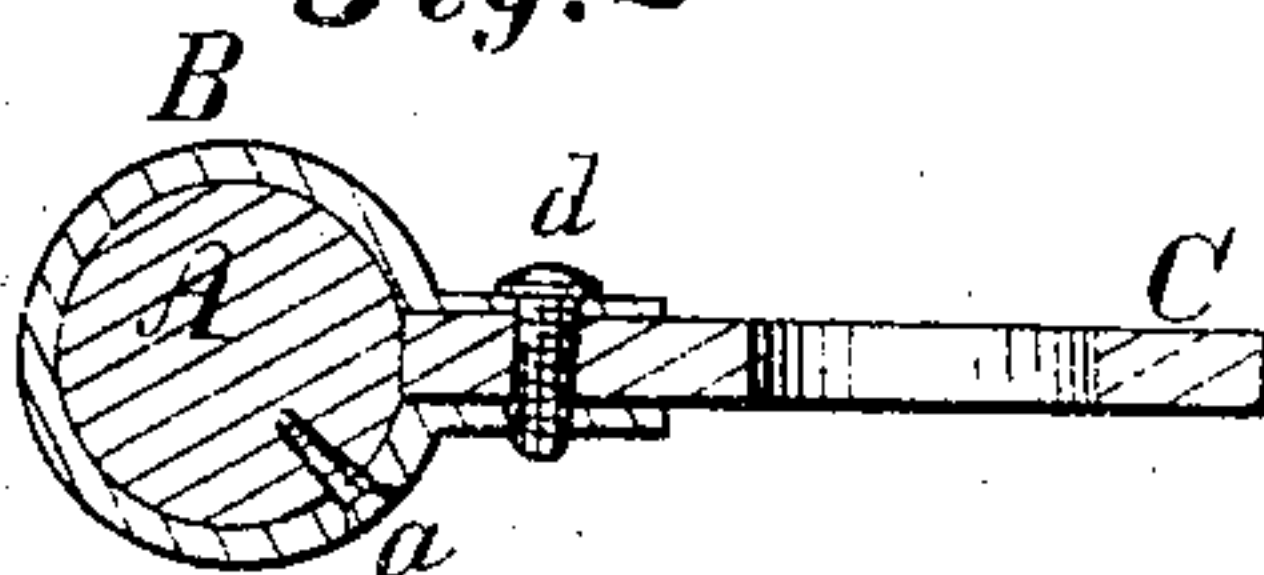

IMPROVEMENT IN NECK-YOKE.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that we, E. COVERT and J. C. COVERT, of Farmer Village, in the county of Seneca, and in the State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Neck-Yokes; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

In the annexed drawings, making part of this specification, A represents a neck-yoke, constructed in any of the known and usual ways. B represents a clasp which surrounds the yoke, lying in the broad groove at its centre, the ends of said clasp embracing between them the leather, C, which connects the yoke to the pole. The leather, C, has one end placed between the ends of the clasp, and is there confined by means of the screws *d d*. A screw, *a*, passes through the clasp into the pole, to keep it from turning. *e* represents the hole in the leather through which the pole passes. The clasp B is made of malleable iron or other suitable metal. We make, by this construction, a very simple and durable attachment for a neck-yoke.

What we claim, is—

The metallic clasp B, connecting the leather, C, to the neck-yoke A, substantially as and for the purpose set forth.
