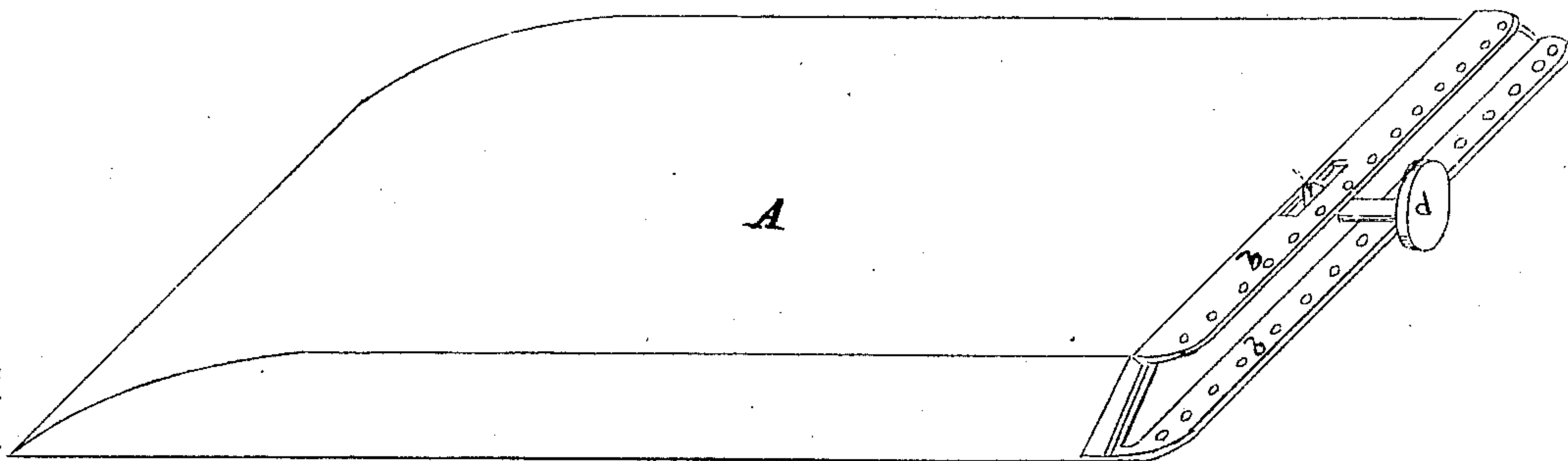

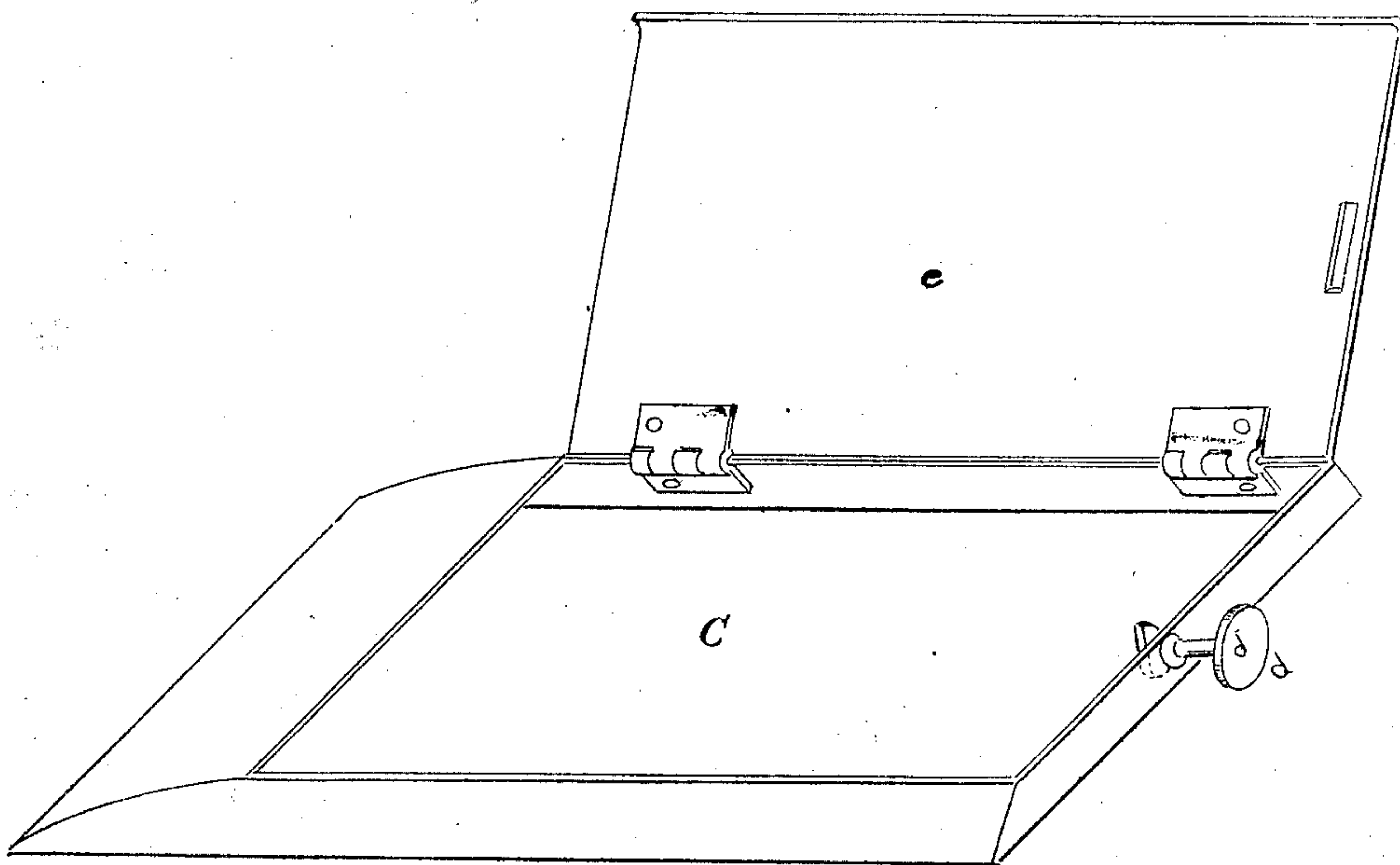

IMPROVEMENT IN SAFETY-POCKETS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

Be it known that I, CYRUS SANBORN, of Chichester, in the county of Merrimack, and State of New Hampshire, have invented a new and useful Improved in Safety-Pocket; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the construction and operation of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of it closed.

Figure 2 is a perspective view of inner case opened.

In the construction of my safety-pocket, I use two boxes or cases, one sliding into and out of the other.

In the drawings, A denotes a box or case open at the top, provided with perforated rims or flanges *b b*, for the purpose of fastening it to the pocket of the garment in which it is used, by means of threads or wire. This case is to remain permanently in the pocket of the garment. C denotes a box or sliding case, which is to slide into and out of the box or case A, at the upper end of it, it being provided with a latch or catch, *d*, to secure it after being inserted into the box or case A. This sliding case is also provided with a door or cover, *e*, which, when closed, makes the case a close box. When this pocket is used, valuables are placed within the sliding case C, the cover closed, and the case inserted into the outer case A, and secured there by means of the latch or catch *d*.

This pocket can be made of tin, leather, rubber, or any suitable material.

I claim the said improved safety-pocket, consisting of the case A secured to the apparel, into which the case C is arranged to slide and fasten, substantially as herein set forth.
