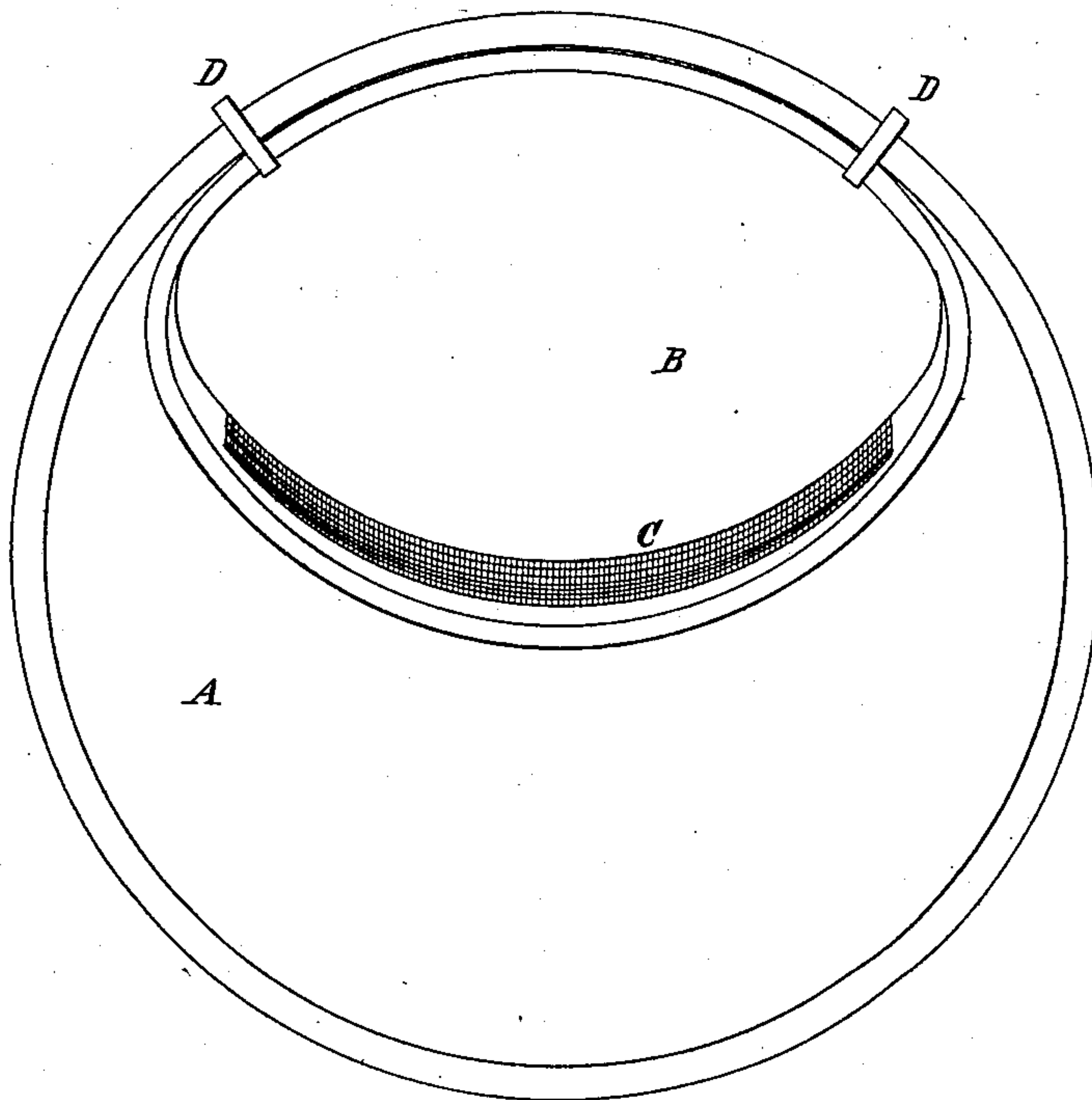


W^m Dunn

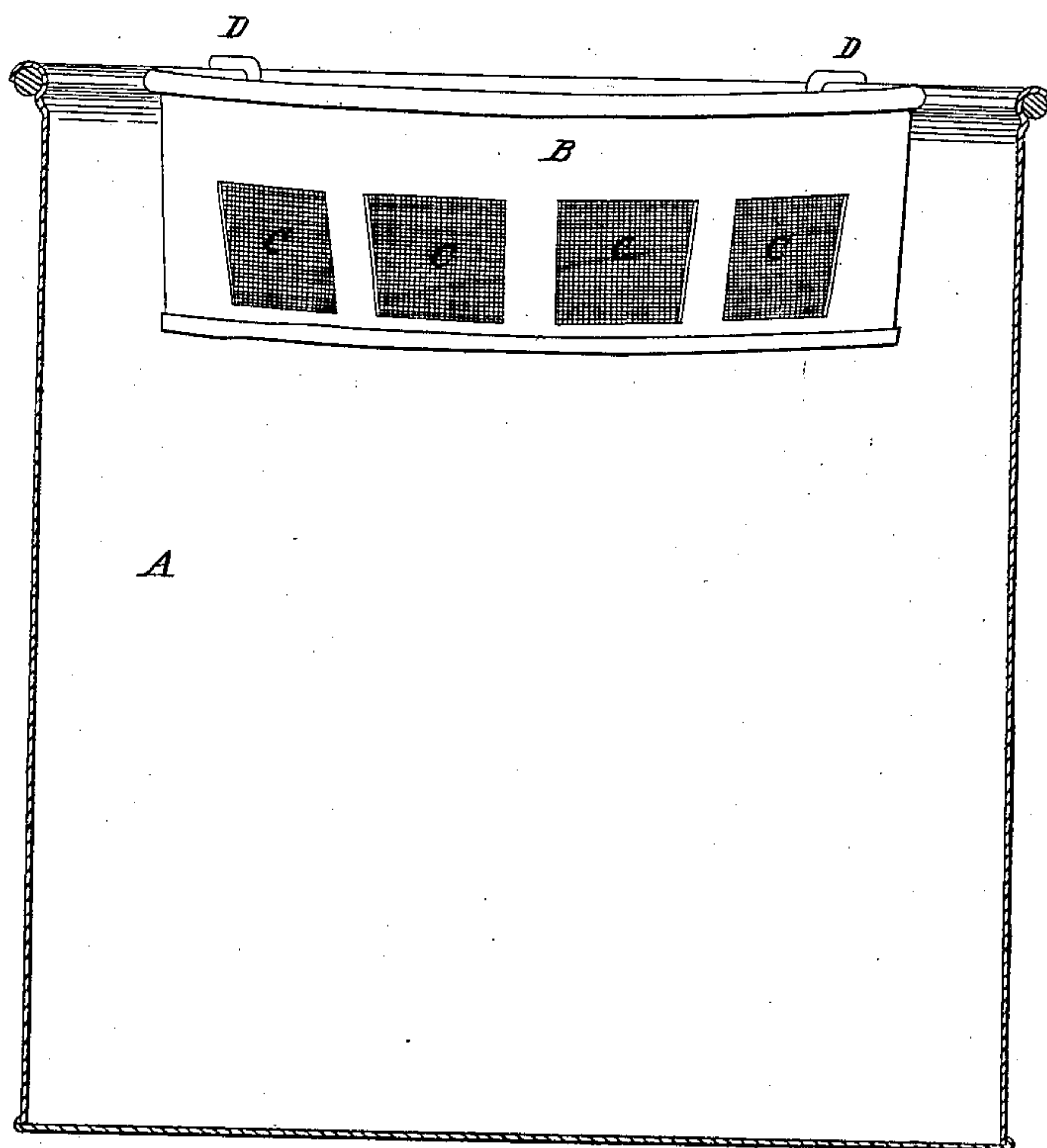

IMPROVED STRAINER FOR FLUIDS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM DUNN, of Argosville, Schoharie county, and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Devices for Straining Fluids and Substances; and do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the figures and letters marked thereon. Of these drawings—

Figure 1 is a plan view of a vessel containing my improved straining-device, and

Figure 2 is a vertical section of the vessel taken just in front of the straining-device.

This invention consists in the insertion, in vessels intended to strain cheese, starch, milk, or other fluids or substances, of a device constructed in the form of a small box or pan, or in any other suitable form, and containing in the side or wall thereof a small piece of wire sieve, by means of which the straining is effected.

A is the vessel into which passes the fluid, leaving the sediment or substance within the strainer B, by reason of this strainer having in its outer wall a piece of wire sieve, C. This strainer is attached within the vessel by means of the arms or hooks D D, or in any other suitable manner, so that it is easily put into or taken out of the vessel. It is evident that my device can be inserted into cheese, milk, or starch, or other vessels, in which the operation of straining is necessary to be performed.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The arrangement of a strainer within a vessel, such strainer having a wire gauze or sieve in its wall, and attachments for the purpose of connecting it to one side of the vessel, substantially as and for the purpose described.
