

IMPROVEMENT IN BAG-HOLDERS,

The Schedule referred to in these Xetters Patent und making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, E. C. FAIRCHILD, of Sunderland, in the county of Franklin, and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new Improvement in Bag-Holder; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent, in-

Figure 1, a side view of the holder with the bag attached, and in

Figure 2 a vertical section of the same.

This invention is designed for the use of planters and others for filling sacks of grain, the object being to support the bag in the proper position, and at the same time a funnel for the mouth of the bag, through which the grain is poured into the bag, and the invention consists in the arrangement of a metallic frame, of funnelshape, provided with hooks upon its lower edge for supporting the bag, and with a hook upon one side, and combined with a plate constructed with several lugs, upon either one of which the said funnel may be set to adjust the funnel to the proper height.

To enable others to construct my improvement, I will proceed to describe the same as illustrated in the

accompanying drawings.

A is a plate, which may be secured to a post or in any convenient position, and constructed with one or more projecting lugs a, formed V-shape upon their edges. B is a funnel-shaped frame, formed from any suitable metal or material, provided at its lower edge with hooks d, and upon one side with a projecting arm, C, the said arm being constructed so as to hook on to either of the lugs a, and support the frame B, as denoted in the drawings. I mean by funnel-shaped frame, a frame which expands from its lower edge upward, and as clearly seen in fig. 2. The plate A is arranged and securely attached in any convenient position, and the frame B placed upon the proper lug, according to the height of the bag to be filled, then the bag D is attached thereto by means of the hooks d upon the lower outer edge of the frame B. In this position the bag is filled through the funnel B, then removed, and another bag placed thereon, and so on:

By this arrangement the bag-holder is easily adjusted to different heights of the bag, and is extremely

cheap and durable in its construction.

Having thus fully described my invention, what I claim as new and useful, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

The funnel-shaped mouth or frame B, provided upon its lower edge with books d, and upon one side with an arm, C, and combined with a plate, A, which said plate is constructed with lugs a, for the adjustment of the frame B, and arranged in the manner substantially as set forth.
