


IMPROVED HAT-HOOK.

The Schedule referred to in these Aetters Patent und making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, John Harvey, of Scranton, in the county of Luzerne, and in the State of Pennsylvania, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Hat-Hooks; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and the letters of reference marked thereon.

In the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification, A represents a metallic plate of any required dimensions, and is provided with projections z and x, from one side of it, as shown in the drawings, and a long slot or hole, which corresponds with and in which fits a movable tongue or arm, B. The arm B is provided with trunnions, which fit and work in the projections z z, and projects downward or outward from said trunnions. A spring, C, is attached to the projection of the arm B at one end, and to the plate A at the other, and throws and holds the said arm out at right angles with the plate A. The arm B may be shut or closed up into the groove in the plate A, and there held by means of a small button, h, whenever desired.

The plate A may be screwed to the under side of a seat in church or other public place, and thus furnish a convenient and suitable hook upon which to hang a hat or cap.

Having thus fully described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is— The arrangement of the plate A, arm B, and spring C, when the several parts are constructed substantially as and for the purpose specified.
