## IMPROVED COMPOSITION FOR ROOFING.

The Schedule referred to in these Xetters Patent and making part of the same.

## TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, John H. Hood, of Danville, in the county of Livingston, and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Roofing; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification.

My improvement consists in the construction of roofs in the manner hereinafter described.

In the first place, I cover the roof with stout paper, which is secured to the boards by strips of oil or felt-cloth being tacked upon it over the edges. I then take ten (10) gallons of coal-tar and stir in two (2) bushels of plaster and one (1) bushel of saw-dust, for the purpose of giving body to the other ingredients.

When the above materials are thoroughly incorporated, spread them over the paper with a brush. I then take fine crystal rock, and with a fine sieve sift it over the roof, to the thickness of about one-eighth of an inch. Let the compound dry for the term of three weeks. I then mix a suitable quantity of fine crystal rock with coal-tar, say about as one of crystal rock to four of tar, and spread it over the entire roof, which, when dry, will make a very durable and economical roof, as seen from accompanying specimen.

I am aware that coal-tar, as also the crystal rock and plaster, have been combined for roofing purposes, and therefore lay no claim to them; but

What I do claim, is-

A roof prepared as specified, and covered with the compound made in the manner described. In testimony that I claim the foregoing as my own, I affix my signature in presence of two witnesses.
