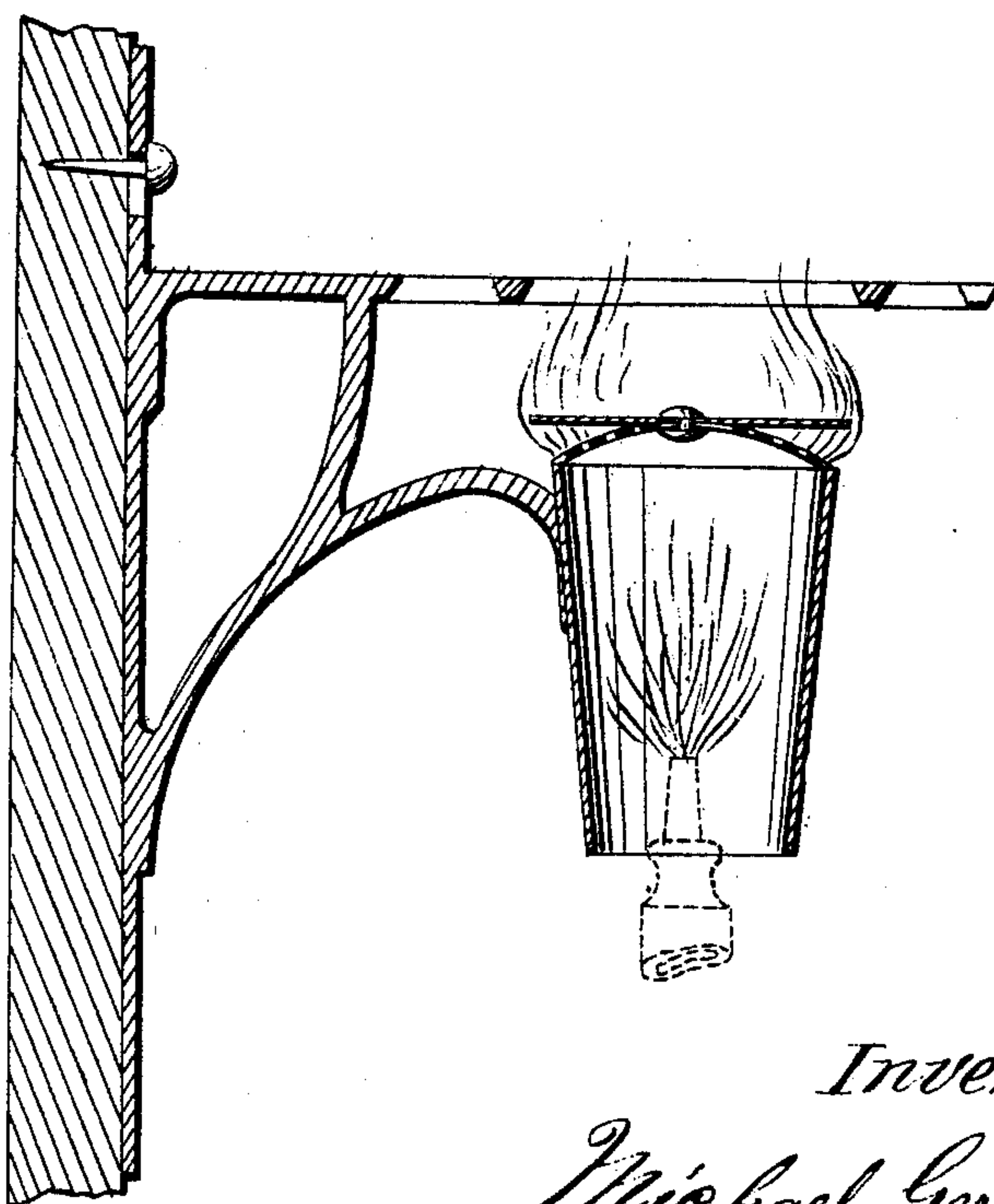
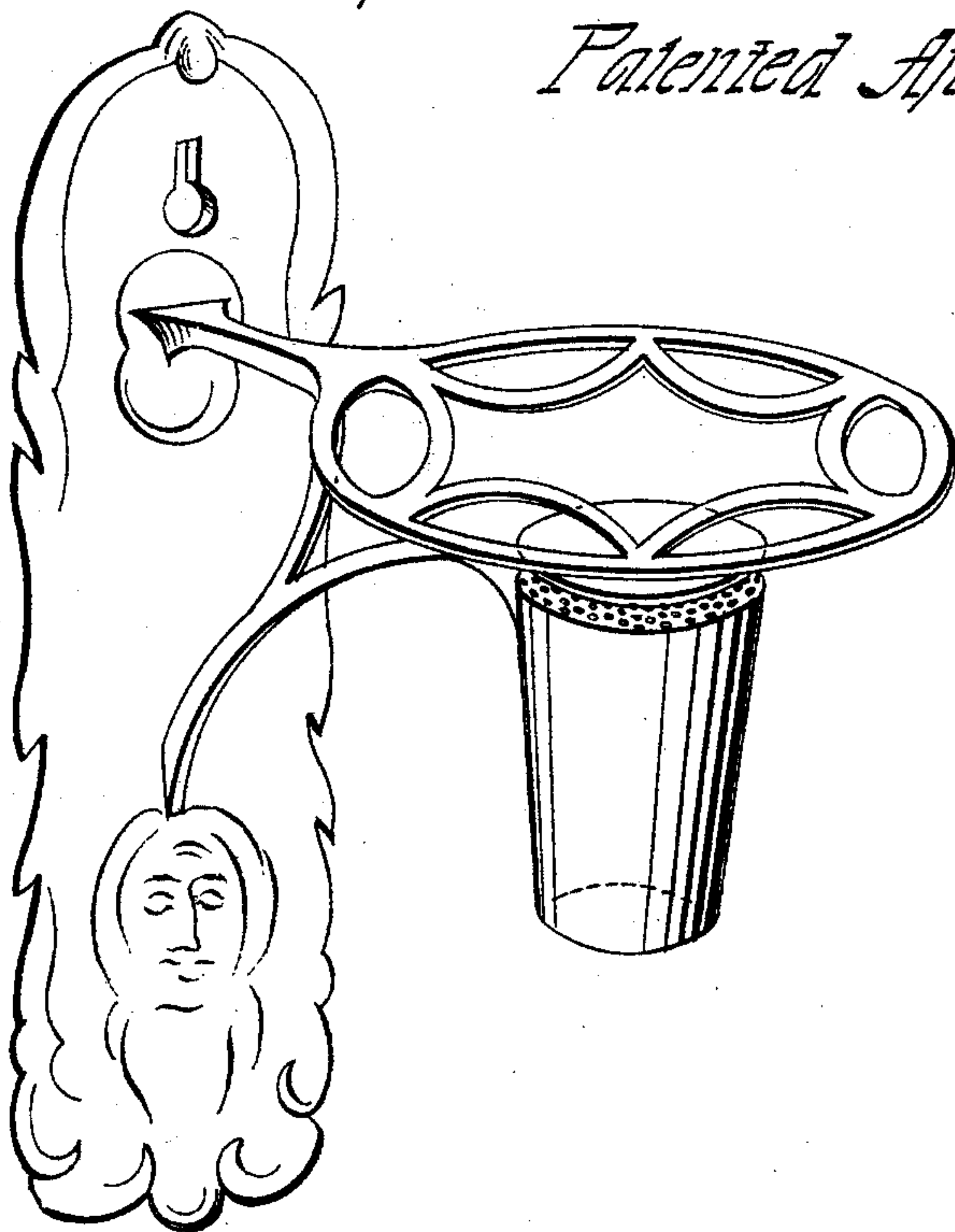

IMPROVEMENT IN GAS COOKING-APPARATUS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, MICHAEL GERMANN, of Cincinnati, in the county of Hamilton, and State of Ohio, have invented a new and useful Apparatus for Cooking with Gas, which is perfectly harmless for those who use it; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description.

The nature of my mechanical invention consists in providing the ordinary gas-burner with an additional burner for general cooking purposes, to be used with an ordinary gas-light, and attached to the wall by a bracket.

To enable others skilled in the art to manufacture my invention, (called Bedroom Companion,) I will proceed to describe its construction and operation.

I construct my cooking-apparatus of an iron bracket and frame, with an additional burner attached thereto, which is a tin tube with a perforated cap, which produces a blue flame without the least smoke.

For general cooking purposes, all that is required to be done is to append it against the wall on a nail or otherwise over the top of any ordinary gas-burner, so as to insert the gas-burner about a quarter of an inch up into the tin burner, then light the gas and place the cooking-utensil upon the bracket.

It can easily be attached to the wall or any other place over a gas-burner, and can also be conveniently detached.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

As an article of manufacture, the gas cooking-apparatus, as described, consisting of an iron bracket, pot-stand, and gas-burner combined, substantially as and for the purposes set forth.
