IMPROVEMENT IN MUCILAGE-BOTTLES.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, HENRY O. BAKER, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and improved Mucilage-Bottle.

The nature of my invention consists in placing a wire across the mouth of the bottle, with the ends of the wire placed in a groove at the base of the neck of the bottle, or in the neck of the bottle.

To enable others skilled in the arts to make and use my invention, I proceed to describe my mode of construction.

Figure I represents a glass, earthen, or metal bottle. Figure A is the mouth of the bottle, and B a wire, or its equivalent, placed across the mouth of the bottle, with the ends of the wire resting in the groove C, which is placed at the base of the neck or in the neck of the bottle; the whole constituting an improved mucilage-bottle, as the wire affords facilities for scraping the brush when too full of mucilage, and thus avoids gumming up the mouth of the bottle.

What I claim as new and useful, and desire to secure by Letters Patent as an improvement, is—

The wire, or its equivalent, in combination with the groove at the base or in the neck of the bottle, substantially and for the purposes as herein set forth.
