


IMPROVED STRAP-FASTENER.

The Schedule referred to in these Actters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, Jerome B. Armstrong, of Corunna, in the county of Shiawassee, and State of Michigan, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Strap-Fasteners; and I do declare the following to be a true and accurate description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, and making part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view, and

Figure 2 is a vertical longitudinal sectional view.

The nature of my invention consists in so constructing a strap-holder that will hold the strap at any desired point, with a tenacity proportioned to the strain on the same, and particularly designed as a hames, girth, and stirrup-strap holder.

To accomplish this purpose, I construct a frame, A, provided with proper hook B, at one end, and a pentagonal cross-bar, C, and strap-bolt, D, at the other end. In the frame, I place a cam, E, terminating in an acute angular edge, F, at the front end, and in a narrow stem, J, at the other, and held in position by a proper bolt, G. The shank of the strap-holder is formed with a recess, H, in which is placed a proper spring, as at I, raising the stem of the cam E, and depressing its angular edge against the cross-bar C, thereby retaining the strap at any desired point.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

- 1. The cam E, provided with the angular edge F and stem J, with the spring I, operating substantially as described, for the purposes set forth.
- 2. The combination and arrangement of the cam E, the recess H, the spring I, with the frame A, the hook B, the cross-bar C, the strap-bolt D, and the bolt G, all operating in the manner specified, and for the purposes set forth.
