IMPROVED COMPOUND FOR DESTROYING PAIN.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

Be it known that I, SAMUEL T. BOND, of the town of Edenton, in the county of Chowan, and State of North Carolina, having discovered a new and useful Compound of Medicines for the Relief of Pain, do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description of the same, viz:

One ounce chloroform.

One ounce sulphate ether.

One ounce spirits camphor.

One ounce spirits ammonia.

Half ounce oil organum.

Put into a bottle, and shake same well before used; and when used, pour some of the mixture into a plate, as the case may be, and take a piece of soft brown paper, regulating the size according to the part diseased, and saturate well with the compound, and apply immediately to the part diseased, once or twice, as the case may be, always laying some article of cloth or pocket-handkerchiefs on the paper, when applied, and pressed with the hand, and immediate relief is had. If allowed to remain on too long, there is some danger of drawing a blister.

It is an external application entirely, and its effect is more like magic than otherwise, the effect produced being instantaneous.

I do not claim the invention of any one of the ingredients of my medicine, now named by me "The Magic Pain-Destroyer," but—

What I do claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The combining the ingredients named in the specification, substantially as therein described, or in any similar proportion to produce the same results.
