IMPROVED COMPOUND FOR DESTROYING INSECTS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Martin Haas, of the city, county, and State of New York, have discovered a new and useful admixture for the destruction of moth in carpets, costly fabrics, furniture, &c., and that the following is a precise statement of the component ingredients to be used in its manufacture.

The ingredients used for this admixture consist of benzine, sulphurous ether, camphor, and *Oleum sinapis*, of which benzine forms the prominent body; the latter three being in about equal parts, forming one-sixth part of any given quantity.

Furthermore, and apart from its moth-destroying

property, I have also made it my object, by its means to effect a thorough cleaning of, and in a measure restore the original strength, lustre, and faded colors, to fine fabrics. It contains no poisonous substance.

What I claim as my discovery, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The compound admixture in the proportions specified, and for the purpose set forth.
