

IMPROVED IRONING-TABLE.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, OPHELIA C. HOTCHKISS, of Cortlandville, county of Cortland, and State of New York, have invented a new and improved Table for Ironing Skirts and Dresses; and I do declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

My invention consists of a table, the bed of which is formed of two tapering pieces, joined together by means of slides or dowels, d d, marked bed a and bed B.

Bed B is so constructed that it can be readily detached from the bed a, and the frame c c' on which it rests.

Bed a is fastened at one end to frame c c' by means of a bolt or swivel-joint, so that one end of bed a can

be turned laterally from frame $c\,c'$, to enable the dress or skirt to be placed thereon, and then returned to frame $c\,c'$, where it is held in its place by means of block D', fitting in a mortise or its equivalent in frame $c\,c'$.

The table, with bed B detached, is designed specially as an ironing-table for skirts and dresses, and, when combined, is intended for ironing-purposes in general, or to be used as a kitchen-table.

What I claim, is—

The combination of the beds a and B with the frame c c' and dowels d d, arranged and operating as and for the purposes specified.
