

IMPROVED FABRIC FOR THE MANUFACTURE OF PAPER COLLARS, CUFFS, &c.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES RESTEIN, of the city of Philadelphia, county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and improved Paper-Stock, for the Manufacture of Paper Collars, Shirt-Fronts, and Cuffs; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the construction and operation of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my invention consists in so constructing the paper-stock from which paper collars, shirt-fronts, and cuffs are manufactured, that I am enabled to make it as strong as linen or muslin, and thus prevent its tearing or giving way at the button-holes, which is now so common with the ordinary material from which these articles are manufactured, and to prevent which, the button-holes have to be lined with muslin, or the stock composed of a layer of muslin placed between two or more sheets of white paper, which is expensive.

To enable those skilled in the art to make and use my invention, I will now proceed to describe its construction and operation.

The drawings represent the paper-stock, with various layers torn off.

A is a fibrous hemp paper, made expressly for this purpose, and composed entirely of hemp, and is therefore extremely tough.

On one side of A is pasted a plain white paper, B, and on the opposite side, a white enamelled linen-imitation paper, C.

The arranging and pasting of these papers will be well known to those skilled in the art of fancy-paper manufacturing.

Having thus described my invention, its construction and operation,

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

A paper-stock, for the manufacture of paper collars, shirt-fronts, and cuffs, when the same is composed of the material, and arranged substantially as herein specified
