IMPROVED METALLIC ROOFING.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 85,806, dated January 12, 1869.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Levi S. Enos, of Chicago, in the county of Cook, and in the State of Illinois, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Metallic Roofing; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof.

The nature of my invention consists in the combination of block-tin and lead for metallic roofing, which will be much cheaper and more durable than any metallic roofing now in use.

The proportions of the ingredients are as follows, viz: one-fourth of a pound block-tin to one pound lead, or one part block-tin to four parts of lead.

In cases where a finer compound is required,

I may use the metals in equal proportions, part for part.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

As an article of manufacture, a metallic roofing composed entirely of block-tin and lead, substantially as herein set forth.
