IMPROVED COMPOUND FOR RENEWING HAIR.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, A. L. Baker, of Newark, in the county of Essex, and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and improved Compound for Preserving Hair; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same.

This invention relates to an improved compound for the hair, designed to preserve it, and restore its growth in cases of baldness, which I propose to designate "Calla Cream."

I take, bay rum, one-half pint; alcohol, one-half pint; oil castor, two ounces; spirits camphor, one-half ounce; tincture cantharides, one-fourth ounce; ex-

tract Lilium candidum, one-fourth ounce; oil neroli, fifteen drops; and mix together, thereby forming a compound which I have found to be highly useful as a preservative and restorative of the human hair.

Having thus described my invention,

I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The compound herein described, substantially as specified.
