IMPROVED MEDICAL COMPOUND.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 88,681, dated April 6, 1869.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS S. TUGGLE, M. D., of the city of Columbus, in the county of Muscogee and State of Georgia, have invented a new and useful compound for curing all maladies arising from impure blood and imperfect digestion; and the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the ingredients and the proportion in which they are used:

Compound Extract Xanthox. Frax.

R. *Liq. potass. arsenitis*, f 3 ii.

Iodohyd. potassii, 3 vi.

Ext. Xanthox. frax., $\frac{3}{4}$ i ss.

Sirup simplex, $\frac{3}{4}$ xiii ss.

S. Tea-spoonful three or four times a day.

Or, in other words, take of Fowler's solution of arsenite of potassa, two fluid drams; iodohydrargyrate of potassium, six drams; extract prickly-ash, one and a half ounce; simple sirup, thirteen and a half ounces, and mix.

The object of my invention is to have a proper and efficient medicine suitably pre-

pared and put up in such a manner as to be convenient and always in readiness for use, for all the impurities generated in the human system, and to save the risk of mistakes by druggists and pharmacutists in compounding and putting up prescriptions; and it consists in the mixture of the above-named substances in the proportions enumerated.

The utility of the compound for the purposes above named has been thoroughly tested for a sufficient length of time to establish the fact of its curative qualities over all other remedies that have yet come to my knowledge.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A compound extract *Xanthox. frax.*, as a new article of trade and use, prepared and put up in bottles, for the purposes herein set forth.
