


IMPROVED CHILD'S CRIB.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Mrs. A. R. SWARTZ, of Carlisle, in the county of Cumberland, and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and improved Child's Crib; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part of this specification.

This invention relates to improvements in cribs or cradles for children, having for its object to provide an adjustable arrangement of the same, calculated to adapt them to various conditions, suited to children of different ages or conditions of physical activity.

The invention consists in the provision of adjustable bottoms for the cribs, whereby the beds may be adjusted nearer to or further from the tops of the railing, according to the activity of the child, and its consequent danger of falling out.

Figure 1 represents a transverse sectional elevation of a crib, constructed according to my improvement, and.

Figure 2 represents a longitudinal sectional elevation of the same.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

A represents a rectangular crib, which I propose to construct similarly to those in use, except that for the

purpose of supporting two or more sets of brackets or supports B, for holding the bottom in a higher or lower position, I interpose one or more sections of side and end rails, C, between the bottom and top rails, and on the said intermediate sections, and the bottom sections, I support the said bottom-holding

brackets.

I make the bottom preferably of canvas, stretched upon a rectangular framé, in one complete part, and capable of ready adjustment from one set of brackets B to another, so that, in the case of a young child not able to climb up or over the sides, it may with safety be placed in the highest position, while older and more active children, who would be unsafe in the said elevated position, may be placed lower within the frame for safety.

Having thus described my invention,

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Let-

ters Patent, is—

Oribs for children, having the bottoms adjustable as to height, by means of the brackets B, arranged at different heights under the crib, as herein shown and described, for the purpose specified.
