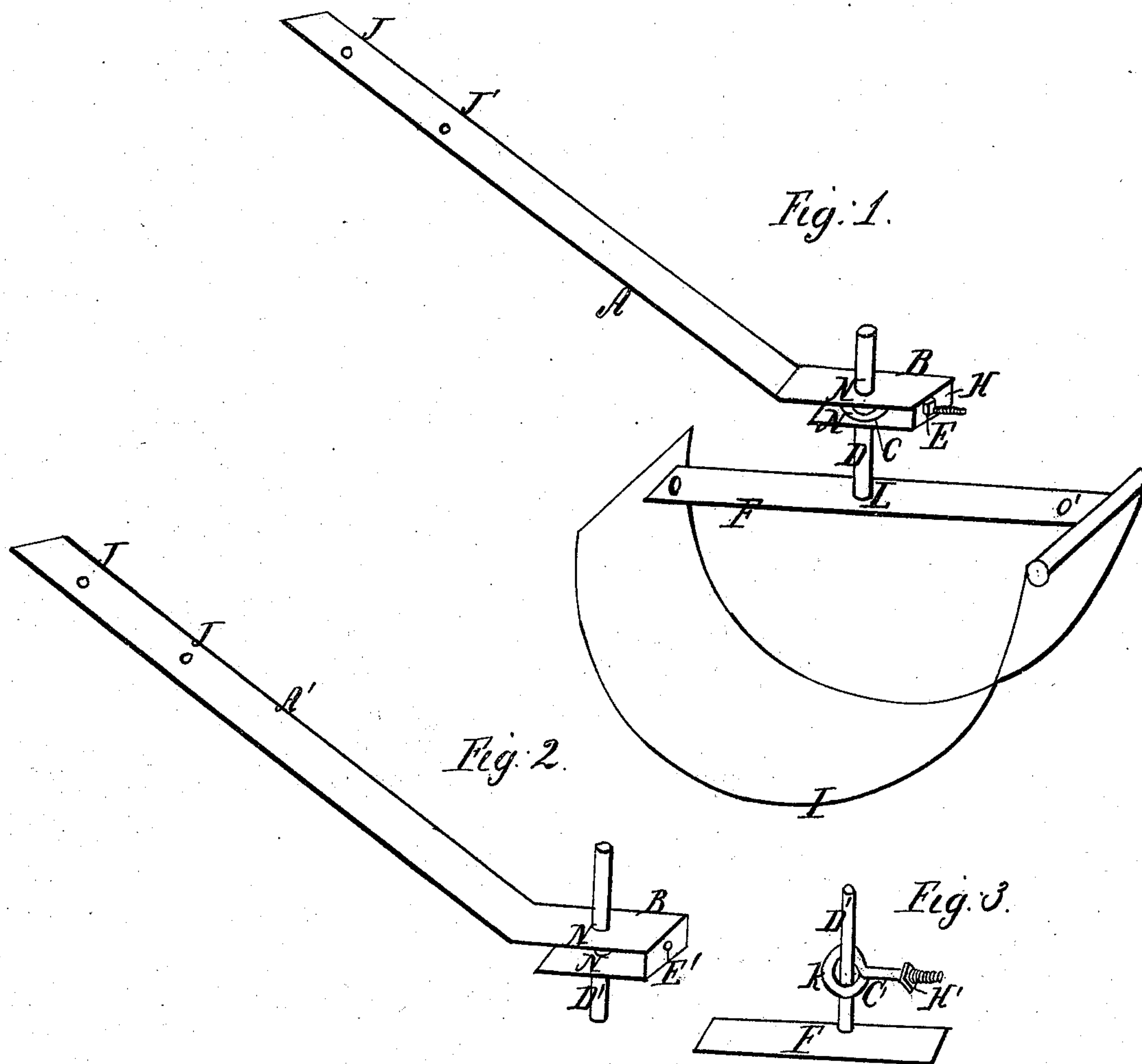

IMPROVED EAVES-TROUGH SUPPORTER.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, A. G. PERRY, of Clyde, in the county of Sandusky, and State of Ohio, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Eaves-Trough Supporters; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description of the construction and operation of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view.

Figure 2, a transverse section.

Figure 3, a detached view.

My invention has for its object the improvement of eaves-trough supporters, and consists of a combination of devices hereinafter more fully described.

A represents a strap of iron, which is nailed fast to the roof, through the holes J and J, at the opposite end of which a jaw is bent, as seen at B, for the reception of the eye-bolt C, or C', as shown in figs. 1 and 3, and D, the upright shaft.

E represents a hole, through which the eye-bolt

passes, for the reception of the burr H, which, if screwed tight, will tighten the eye against the shaft, and the shaft against the upper and lower holes in the jaw B, and, by this means, the trough is adjusted and held at any point that may be desired.

F represents the cross-bar, to which the upright shaft is made fast in the centre, L. The ends of the cross-bar are also made fast to the inside, and near the upper edge of the trough, at O and O.

Having thus described my invention,

What I claim, and wish to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The strap A, with a jaw, B, in combination with the upright shaft D, bolt C, with an eye K and bar H when used with the cross-bar F, all arranged substantially as described, as and for the purpose set forth.
