


## IMPROVED REVOLVING CLOTHES-DRIER.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN McCASKEY, Jr., of Orrville, in the county of Wayne, and State of Ohio, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Revolving Clothes-Frames; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification, and in which—

Figure 1 represents a side view of my revolving clothes-frame; and

Figure 2, a plan view of the same.

Similar letters indicate like parts in both figures.

My invention consists in the employment of a slide, to which are pivoted arms, sliding into a slotted revolving cap, as and for the purpose hereinafter set forth.

To enable others skilled in the art to which my invention appertains, to make and use the same, I will now describe its construction and operation.

In the accompanying drawings—

*a* represents the base, and *b*, the stem, to the upper end of which is secured the circular revolving cap *c*, said cap being formed around its circumference with slots *d d*.

*e* is a wire ring, secured to the base of the cap, near the circumference, in order to retain the upper ends of the arms *f f f* into the slots *d d*, into which they are slid.

*f f f* represent the arms, the upper ends being slid in the slots *d d*, as described, and their lower ends pivoted to the slotted slide *g*, sliding upon the stem *b*.

It will be seen that when the slide is raised, the weight of the outer ends of the arms will retain the same in a position at right angles with the stem.

Having thus described my invention,

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A revolving clothes-frame, consisting of the stem or standard *b*, base *a*, cap *c*, formed with slots *d d*, ring *e*, arms *f f f*, and sliding button *g*, all combined, arranged, and operating substantially in the manner and for the purpose described.
