

IMPROVEMENT IN FENCE.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Thomas Harrison, of La Fayette, in the county of Walworth, and State of Wisconsin, have invented a new and useful Mode of Building and Constructing Field and Farm-Fences; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the construction and uses of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawing, making a part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a joint view of two or more sections or

panels; and

Figure 2 is a single section or panel.

The rails A A are woven upon the battens B B', the latter being arranged in the centre in such position that they are retained, without nails, by the spring of the rails, which are screwed, or otherwise secured to the posts B, their ends extending in such manner that those of one panel overlap the post of the next.

O c is a brace, resting on the ground, and secured on the panels, on alternate sides, as shown.

For hill-sides, these braces should be suitably short-ened or lengthened.

What I claim as my invention, is—

1. The fence-panel, constructed, as described, of vertical battens and woven horizontal rails.

2. The alternate arrangement of the extension of the rails of one panel, in combination with the adjacent post of the next panel, as shown.

3. In combination with a fence-panel, constructed as set forth in the first claim, the braces C c, constructed substantially as described.
