IMPROVED MEDICAL COMPOUND OR "BITTERS."

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 93,209, dated August 3, 1869.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Joseph Lladó, of New Orleans, parish of Orleans, and State of Louisiana, have invented a new and Improved Medical Compound, called the "Wanata Guaco Bitters;" and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use it.

The present invention relates to a new and improved medical compound, especially intended to strengthen and to increase the action of the stomach, (i. e., a stomachic,) which compound consists of the following ingredients: Guaco root, one dram eighteen grains; calamus, half dram; false alcanet, half dram nine grains; mace, nine grains; cloves, nine grains;

cinnamon, half dram; fennel-seed, half dram; camomile, twenty-seven grains; coriander, eighteen grains; sage, half dram; orange-peel, one dram thirty grains; white sirup, two ounces; spirits, 20°, two and a half pounds; and water, four ounces.

Infuse during ten days, and then filter. Dose, one wine glassful before meals.

I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The medical compound made of the several ingredients, mixed together in or about the proportions, substantially as described.
