

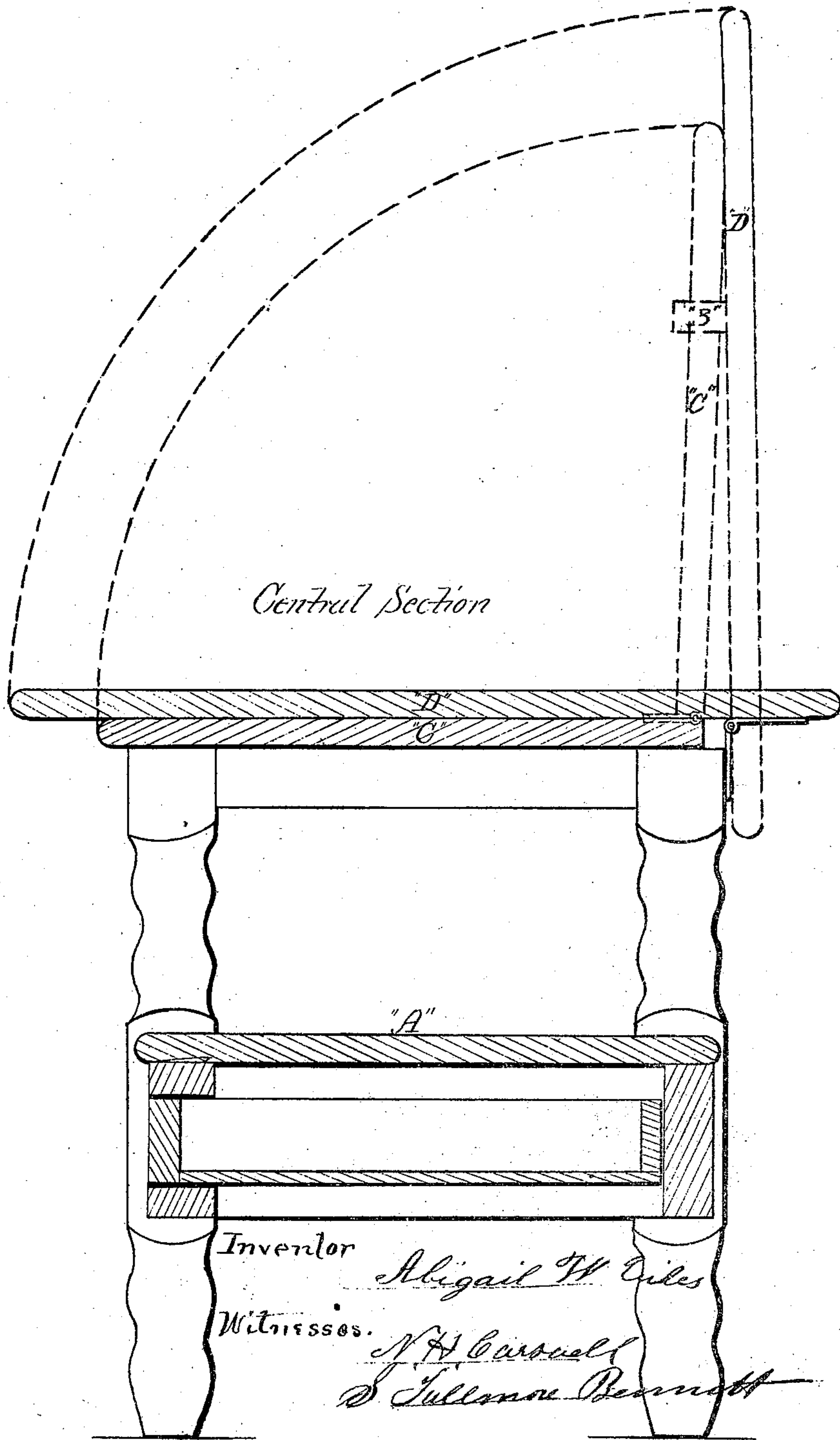

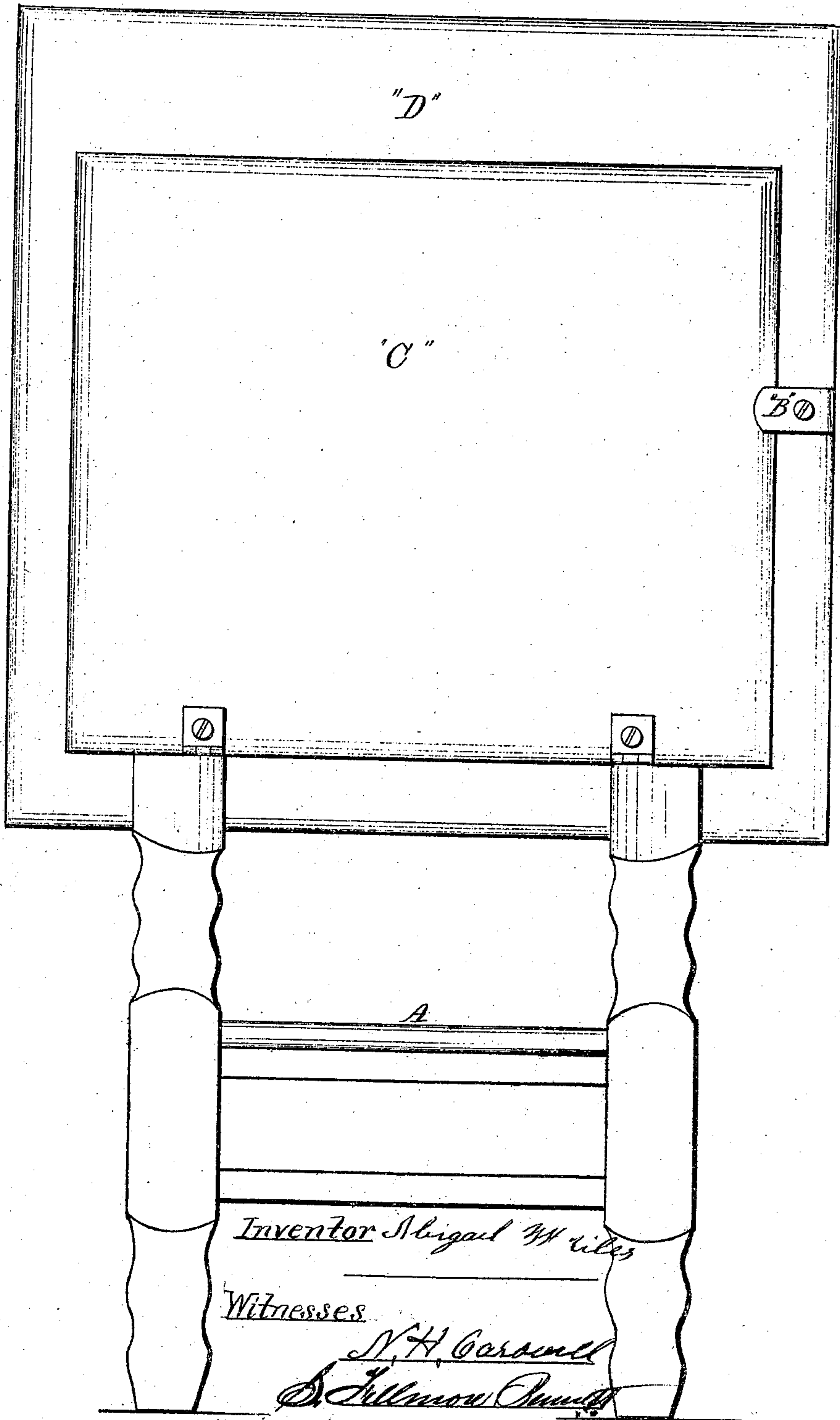

IMPROVED CHAIR, TABLE, AND STAND COMBINED.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ABIGAIL W. VILES, of the village of Elkhorn, county of Walworth, and State of Wisconsin, have invented a new Combination Chair, Table, and Stand; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing.

I make the chair A of any convenient material and size or shape to serve the purpose of a chair, sofa, lounge, bench, or settee, and to serve as a support for the table D and stand C, and may be fitted with one or more drawers, to suit, and casters, for convenience in moving.

The table D and stand C are attached to the chair

A by butts and screws, as shown in the drawing, or in any other manner convenient for raising them up and holding them in a perpendicular position.

The table D and stand C are held together with a button, B, as shown in drawing.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The combination of the chair A, with the table D and stand C, substantially as specified.
