

#### IMPROVED METALLIC REMEDY FOR RHEUMATISM.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Moses Bernheim, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and improved Metallic Remedy for Rheumatism, nervous, and all other diseases of kindred nature.

Figure A represents the metallic remedy when fully

finished.

Figure B represents a semicircular piece of zinc, with the interior cut out.

Figure C represents a thin piece of woollen cloth.

To enable others to make my invention, I will de-

scribe its construction and application.

I take a thin piece of copper, and cut it the required size and shape, and then I take a thin piece of zinc, and cut it one-half the size and shape of the copper, and then I cut from the interior, leaving the same about one-quarter of an inch in width, and then I take a piece of woollen cloth, and cut it the same size and shape as the copper; I then fold this woollen cloth

over the zinc, and double the copper, and insert the zinc covered with the woollen cloth in the copper, and givet the same together

rivet the same together.

This metallic remedy must be soaked in salt and water twenty-four hours, and then placed on the spine, just below the neck, and to be worn there twenty-four hours, and then changed for another that has also been soaked twenty-four hours in salt and water, and so on till the cure is effected.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is—

The combination of copper, zinc, and woollen cloth, and applied in the manner, form, and place, as herein set forth, to attain the cure of rheumatism, nervous and other kindred diseases.
